COLORADO MINERS' TROUBLE.

Exiles Outlaws and Their Depreda-
tions.—A Startling Find—Dynam-
ite Cartridge Explosion.

James Carmine, the only survivor of the terrible mining disaster at King-
man, is still alive. He has been impossible
to bring him to consciousness, and he
remains in a state of faint agony ever
since the accident.

John Young has returned from the
gold fields. He brought in some of the
largest specimens of gold that have
been seen here. His company has
located forty acres about six miles
from the Warm Springs—Idaho
Territory.

The explosion of a dynamic car-
tridge mortally injured Letty Case,
who has been prospecting for mineral
at Cheyenne Canyon, Colorado. Three
fingers of one hand were badly
mangled and a piece of flesh was
torn from one of his legs.

Colorado Springs capitalists are dis-
cussing the construction of an electric
road from the city to Pueblo. One
of the chief attractions is the twenty-five mile
stretch of unbroken beauty which is said to be a scenic line of un-
rivalled attractions.

The police authorities of Brownsville,
Texas, have been kept busy
during the past few days protecting

plan to add a committee of the board
of trade to the next colony from Hellid

Thomas J. Puttling, manager of the
Denver Investment and Banking cor-

completely glutted in fact, and utterly
at a loss for investments, but none the
less exceedingly timid about anything
out of everything outside the British
isles.

Missouri, Arizona, has been
made defendant in an action brought
in the district court by State Engineer
James P. Maxwell, to recover \$1,578.18.
Mr. Maxwell set up that on September
12, 1889, the board of county commis-
sioners of Garfield county filed with
the state engineer's office the boundary
line of Garfield county on the north,
and Pem and Mesa counties on the south,
so indefinite that a portion of the territory
was claimed by each. The state engi-
neer says that he ran a line and furnished
a map of the same, but the line in
the map did not coincide with the
boundary line of the county. The
court ruled that the map should be
revised.

The agricultural department of the
university of Wyoming has issued
bulletin No. 9, which relates to experiments
in beet sugar culture in 1892. The
last twenty-one analyses of beets
grown in eighteen different farms in
various parts of the state gave an
average of 16.50 sugar in juice, or 15.50
per cent sugar in beets with a purity of
78.00 per cent. The excellence of these
beets is judged when it is stated that the
average yield of the beets was 15.50 per cent
of the Nevada factor. In 1891 was 16 per cent, and in
1892 was 15.50 per cent. The bulletin
is from the pen of the chemist, Prof.
E. C. Gleason.

Last week the taxpayers of El Paso,
Texas, voted the issuance of \$250,000
bonds for the construction of an entire
new system of waterworks in the city.
The new system on the part of the
city was an assessment of the very
lightest upon individual, slim quota of
water furnished by the El Paso
water company owned principally by
Sylvester Ward of St. Louis. The
attorneys for the latter subsequently
sued the city for damages and pre-
pared a series of demands, including
restricting the city from issuing the
bonds. The case is set for the 25th, and in
the meantime the city is making
preparations to issue the bonds and
begin the construction of the new
system before the court can take
any action.

One of the most startling findings
made in the Canyon City, Colorado,
has been unearthed at Rock
vile, a small mining camp nine miles
northwest of that place. The Santa Fe
railroad company, which has large min-
ing interests in that part, was exca-
vating in the bottom of a gulch for the
purpose of putting in a mine there,
when a peculiar formation was
encountered. The workmen stopped to
examine, and on digging around the spot
the structure was found to be a
perfectly formed bomb, twelve feet in
length. This find caused a great
excitement, and other miners followed
the example of the discoverer, and
began to dig, finding another
explosive device and as thick through
as a man's body and perfectly petrified.
This caused still greater excitement,

and all work was stopped to dig for
mines. Another similar object was
also yet discovered. The remains
were found at a depth of three feet.
Data is yet missing as far as
the quantity of petrified lava was
true, the finds are stated to be
true.

Convicts working in the stone quar-
ries near the penitentiary of Boise have
