Goes to Park City—State Supd. A. C. Nelson has gone to Park City to attend a teachers' institute.

UTAH IRRIGATED LANDS.

In answer to questions propounded to Governor John C. Cutler, in a letter from Abel Miller, Commissioner of the Bureau of Irrigation, Idaho Auditor J. A. Edwards, enclosed a statement to the effect that the matter had referred, giving the inquirer the following information:

The total acreage of irrigated lands in the State of Utah is 2,150,000, and there are now 1,000 irrigated lands available for irrigation.

The government reclamation projects are the largest, covering 500,000 acres, with a water right cost of \$40 an acre. The state has 250 private irrigation projects, with a water right cost, at an average water right of \$10 per acre.

The irrigated lands of Utah are valued at from \$50 to \$100 per acre.
