Washington, County, Utah, July 9th, 1883. Editor Descret News:

The general health of the people of Washington, at the present time is pretty good, with the exception of a few cases of chills and fever which are common to this place Some who have lived here for years take them occasionally. New comers are very liable to take them. The people are very busy harvest ing—lucerne, wheat and barley. In consequence of the extreme heat the thermometer registering from 100 to 110 degrees in the shade, it makes labor rather trying and se vere. The second crop of lucerne is mostly very heavy, the first cutting being seriously damaged by late rost. Barley and wheat will prob ably be an average crop, and in bulk considerable for a small settlement. Our fruit crop is a complete failure, with the exception of a few grapes being killed by late frost, The loss of our fruit crop will be a serious loss to the people of Wash-ington, being a source of cash revenue; eaid revenue being very I mit ed in this part of the country for some time past, which has been seriously felt by business firms and the people generally. In the meantime the prople are patient and doing the best they can under the circumstances, and I have every reason to believe are fully nive to the signs of the times, and are fully prepared and determined to meet the issues of the hour in a political point of view by every man and woman entitled to vote, faithfully performing that duty in the interest of the community at large.

Our Sunday School is in good con-dition, and other local institutions, our Bishop endeavoring by his pres-ence and counsel to aid and encourage the same.

The Fourth of July vas celebrated in the usual manner, by the peo ple of Washington. In the short space of a few days, Mill Creek, in Washington has been the scene of two heavy floods descending from the Pine Valley Mountain, the first carrying away a portion of the factory reservoir; and whilst in the act of repairing the same a second flood rushed down with terrific force, destroying their labor and seriously damaging the reservoir and causing other wash-

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

Mexico, 12.—It is understood the Mexicon Government, with the ap-proval of a committee of British bondholders, has modified the contract signed in London for the set the authorization granted by Congress, as follows: Four million seven hundred thousand pounds in bonds to be issued by the Mexican treasury in Mexico; Mexican agents in London will collect the Empire's bonds for liquidation. Interest on the new issue of bonds will commence July 1, 1885.

Havana, 12.—A sheet signed by Chief Boneauhea, inciting the peo-ple to rebellion has been put in cir-culation. It says bands are being re-cruited with men, horses and arms, for involutionary purposes. No importance whatever is attached to the sheet, the people of Cuba desir-ing peace. It merely shows that many bands of robbers desire to give their movements a political character. Vozs de Cuba urges the govpanies to suppress the bandits.

St. Paul, 12.—The Northern Paci-fic Express Co., capital \$10,000,000, filed articles of incorporation with the Secretary of State to-day. The express company formerly run by the Northern Pacific railway, the franchise of which was purchased by several eastern capitatiets, will be run as a separate institution. It is announced that H. H. Hoyt, now general manager of the eastern division, will be general manager of the whole Northern Pacific road upon its completion.

Springfield, Ill., 12.—The State Veterinary Surgeon reports glanders prevalent among horses in 19 coun-ties in the State. He clames to ties in the State. He clames to have been prevented from killing the animals sfflicted. Attorneys contended that he could only resort to this measure after the Governor had issued a proc'amation declaring the glanders epidemic. The Attorney General is now expected to give an opinion as to the powers of the State Veterinary Surgeon under the State law.




