Alfredo Gómez, Mexican, arrested on suspicion of having murdered his wife in Phoenix Park today as follows:

"Dear Sir—I have before me your request of recent date, for an opinion as to whether trustees of school districts have any power to retain school taxes in the possession of their respective districts."

Without claiming though generally bodies corporate can exercise no power, it is my opinion that such power is derived by statute, or which by necessary implication arises therefrom.

This seems to be the well-established doctrine in relation to the various powers of school districts, and if no statutory authority can be found expressly delegating such power, or which by necessary implication arises therefrom, then such retention can be legally made.

Among the powers delegated to trustees of school districts I find no provision which would authorize such retention, if not by necessary implication, the trustee is bound to remit the taxes of any person.

## LOOKS LIKE MURDER.

The Body of an Aged Italian Found in an Outlying Field.

#### THE OLD MAN DEL VELOCIO.

His Disappearance Was Noted in the News, No. 4—mysterious Circumstances surrounding the Case.

The News of November 4 last contained a notice of the sudden and mysterious disappearance of Vito Del Velocio, an aged Italian, from his home at 1225 S. Second West street, where he had been living with his son Joseph for some time.

Del Velocio strayed away from his home on Friday, October 26, and nothing had been seen of him since, until yesterday morning about 4 o'clock when his son found him lying in a field near the corner of Eleventh North and Fourth West streets.

The appearance of the body suggested to the conclusion that the man had been fully dead with, although there is a probability that he committed suicide.

The discovery of the body was reported by police Headquarters by Adolph Spahr shortly after 4 o'clock, and as Officer G. P. Pratt who was at the station at the time, went out to the scene, as did also Coroner Oldham who was immediately informed of the discovery.

These gentlemen upon arriving at the spot where the body lay, found everything as indicated by Mr. Spahr, the dead man lying in a messy bed, which when laid out had been found in a field near the corner of Eleventh North and Fourth West streets.
