For a long time part his connections have been antagonistic to all the social organizations of old France, which has just succumbed in such a cowardly manner. There is great constarnation, I observe, in the Quarter des Gobellus to day, respecting three battailons captured at Moulin Saquet, who all belong to that quarter. 


