

A DIPLOMAT'S VIEWS

The Austro-Italian Conflict and What it Means.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—When in 1882 the Dreuband or triple alliance between Germany, Austria and Italy was concluded, or rather Italy admitted to the dual league between the two empires, through the efforts of Prince Bismarck, it seemed that the impossible had happened. Italy had become the ally of Austria, her despoiler, her enemy by inheritance, from whose yoke she had freed herself or torn herself away in pieces during the wars of 1848, 1859 and 1866. The great Italian statesman, Cavour, had made it his life work to destroy the Austrian hold upon northern Italy. By the aid of Napoleon III, in 1859, he succeeded in driving the Austrians from Lombardy into the strongholds of the quadrilateral, but had to leave Venice still in their hands. This last foreign foothold south of the Alps became Italian first in November, 1866, after the terrible defeat of Austria by Prussia at Koniggratz. With Victor Emmanuel's entry into the city of the lagoons Italy was united.

But thereby the aims of Italian patriots were not yet fulfilled. With the unification of the Appennine peninsula the national aspirations for the incorporation of the large fragments of Italian people yet under foreign sway began to assert themselves rather aggressively. The cry for the liberation of Italy—Italy unredemmed—has grown in volume every year. The longing for a greater Italy that would embrace at least the neighboring Italian populations still under the rule of Austria, their hereditary racial enemy, is especially strong in the younger generation of the Italian universities, Trieste. The principal seaport of Austria-Hungary, with its extensive commerce and the chief naval station of the dual monarchy; in fact, the pearl in the Austrian crown, is the first goal coveted by the irredentist movement. The southern Tyrol, Istria and Dalmatia, with a large Italian population, are next in demand. If there is a movement for a reconquest of the Swiss-Italian southern cantons, foremost among them Ticino and French Corsica, Nice and Savoy, the cradle of the Italian dynasty, at the price of which Napoleon's aid was purchased against Austria, such a movement is still carefully concealed, until the settlement with Austria shall have been accomplished.

The seriousness of this national Italian movement is quite real, and certified by the recent outbreaks and clashes between German and Italian students at the universities of Innsbruck and Vienna. It is the same movement which in European Turkey works such havoc, inasmuch as the Greeks tend toward a Panhellenic kingdom, while the Bulgarians dream of a restoration of the ancient Bulgarian empire, and the Roumanians would rather die than live under the rule of either. The aspirations of Prince Nicholas of Montenegro for the leadership over the southern Slavic races, and Serbian ambitions do the rest to bring forth a war of all against all. It is the same national movement which will give no rest to the dismembered parts of Poland which, in spite of all, are instinct with life, and await an upheaval which may give them a chance of reconstruction, the same national movement which creates the Danish question and the Alsace-Lorraine question in Germany, and which works the dissolution of Austria-Hungary, as it has wrought the unification of Italy and Germany.

The Italians under Austrian rule are unwilling to give up their nationality, while the Austrian government is averse to the still further development of Italian sentiment and culture. The movement for an Italian university at Innsbruck was, therefore, discouraged and refused. Only when the agitation became overwhelming, an Italian juristic faculty was finally granted, the inauguration of which, however, caused the deep resentment of the academic German element, which was soon reinforced by the Germans in general. The example of Bohemia, where the establishment of a very flourishing Czech university and a powerful school of technology is replacing more and more German intellectual superiority and power may have been a warning to the Germans of the Tyrol and caused their anxiety. The Germans unfortunately forget that chauvinism and violence will only accelerate the movements, and as the blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church, so active violence will but stimulate the Italianization of the Tyrol, an old German land.

Another serious question which is widening the breach between Italy and Austria is the ambitious movement both of Austria and Italy toward the Balkans, notably Albania. This Austrian spread of influence in the vilayets of Scutari, Armatric and Janina, at the expense of Italy, has been made a strong means of political agitation in the peninsula press, which serves to sow a widespread distrust of Austria-Hungary and causes repeated noisy manifestations and bitter denunciations of Austria's ulterior machinations. The Austrian government and press, on the other hand, maintain that a perfect proof of Austrian loyalty and moderation has been furnished by its faithful cooperation with Russia in restoring order in the Balkans. Nevertheless the anti-Austrian demonstrations in Italy have been nourished and encouraged even by the concentration of troops on the Austrian frontier, an unwise, unstatesmanlike step which can only serve to widen the breach and render impossible any concessions in favor of the Italian population in Austria. The ministry of Zanardelli is being approached for catering to the irredentist agitators and demagogues, and for having this pit in jeopardy the larger interests insured by the triple alliance.

The cardinal mistake of the Austrian press is to call those disreputable intrigues of phantoms and legends artificially construed, while the dissections are national, deep rooted and irremediable. They are, unfortunately, grave realities, which have indeed for many years now turned Italy, in spite of formal renewals of the triple alliance, especially through the efforts of the Ger-

for this visit seemed really to terminate the long period of Austro-Italian discord. When the time came for the emperor of Austria to return the visit, this would have been impossible, since it would have meant the recognition, on the part of his apostolic majesty and the most Catholic power of Europe, of the Italian occupation of Rome as a legitimate act against the papacy. Emperor Francis Joseph never returned the visit, and there is hardly any hope that his successor, Francis Ferdinand, ever will. The truth is that the king of Italy and the Italian people were deeply wounded when Francis Ferdinand came to Rome to pay homage to the pope at the Vatican, ignoring entirely the Quirinal. So long as this state of affairs will last, Italy will rightfully feel that her ally, Austria, has not recognized "eternal Rome" as her hiding capital, and until this is done, a real union between the two is impossible. 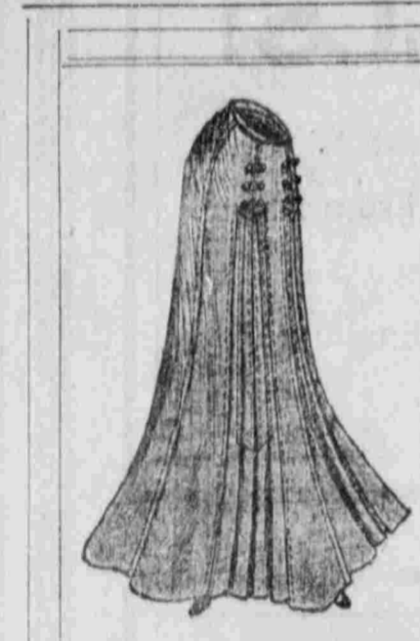
