An Excellent Showing by the Board of Education.

CENSUS EXAMINERS APPOINTED

Fifteen Hundred Dollars Appropriated for the August Interest on the \$500,000 Coupon Bonds.

The city school board met last night, all the members being in attendance except Mr. O. Considerable routine business was transacted.

Census examiners.

Census enumerators were appointed as follows:

The committee on finance recommended that the sum of \$15,000 be appropriated for the interest on the August interest on \$500,000 of bonds and that a voucher for this amount be made in favor of H. T. Davis, treasurer.

Adopted.

George H. Davis offered to sell certain lots on a school building, lot 8, block 10, plat 7, Salt Lake City survey, for \$12,500 of \$10,000, according to the size of the lots. Committee on sites and buildings.

The committee on sites and buildings recommended that the proposition of Mr. W. Hansen for the sale of a school site in the city for \$10,000 be rejected.
