

THE "NEWS" LIBEL SUIT.

The Demurrer to Judge Powers' Complaint Sustained Today.

JUDGE ZANE STATES HIS REASONS.

The Constitution of the United States Guarantees Freedom to the Press.—The Charge Here Not Established.

Just before noon today the demurrer to complaint in the libel suit brought by Judge Orlan Powers against the Desert News Company (the publisher of the present Desert News) was called up and argued by Hon. F. S. Richards on behalf of the defendants, and by Attorney W. H. Dickey and Ogden Hines on behalf of the plaintiff.

The suit was brought by the plaintiff on the strength of an editorial which appeared in the News on July 2nd, 1902.

Attorney Richards contended that the complaint did not contain facts sufficient to constitute a cause of action, there being no libelous matter in it, and hence no ground for damages.
