Be it ena ted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Unit d Stat s of America in Congress as embled, That any person may deposit at any mint or assay office of the United States, eith r assay once of the United States, etcht gold or silver builtor, or both, in quantities of not less than five ounces of gold or eighty onnces of silver, and demand and receive coin certificates therefor at the rate of one dollar in certificates for twenty-five and eight-tenths grains
