Rebellion in Borneo.

Tacoma, Wash., Feb. 5 .- Mat Se Selleh, the rebel leader of North Borneo, has again stirred the natives there inhas again surred the harves there in-to rebellion, according to Oriental ad-vices received here. They commenced warfare last month, attacking Gaya Bay, when the British and Chinese shops were looted. The rebels then re-treated into the jungle. Saveral days later they were followed by a force of 250 blue jackets and Sikh policemen. Five miles inland these were attacked and driven back by Selleh's men, who fred at them from a dense growth of underbrush. A number of the British were killed and wounded. The British gunhoat Rattler proceeded from Labuan

to Gala Bay, where her marines were sent out to reinforce the British.

Gen. Otis issued an order declaring Dagupan, San Fernando de Lauion, Vigan, Laoag and Aparri open for trade under coasting trade regulations. Gen. Otis also issued an order at the same time declaring that trade with the ports of the Sulu archipelago, with those of Zamboanga, Coltabatto and Davao, of the island of Mindanao, and with the island of Basilan be re-established. The ports of Zamboanga, Mindanao, Jolo, island of Jolo, Siassi, and island of Siassi were declared to be open ports for the time being.

In order to prevent an attempt to de-stroy any of the American warships anchored in Manila bay Gen. Otis has issued an order warning residents and all inhabitants that "the presence of small boats propelled by oars or hand paddles in the waters of the outer harbor of Manila, between the hours of sunset and sunrise is prohibited. Should such boats approach a warship of the United States during the period specified they will incur the great danger of being fired upon."

150 miles: New Boston to Austin Junc-tion, on the Nevada Central, 90 miles; Austin Junction to Battle Mountain, 86 miles; total, 526 miles. According to this computation the proposed new line would be 304 miles shorter than present line through northern Califor-
