CANVAS SAVED FLOWERS.

Thousands of beautiful plants in the flower beds at the city and county building were threatened with frost during the late storm. E. Carter, the scretener, had set out 7,000 flower-ing geraniums and other plants just prior to the big storm, and they would surely have been destroyed, but for Mr. Carter's prompt action in covering them with canvas, raised about threa feet above the blossoms, and lanterns placed inside the improvised tents.
