

# NEWS OF THE WEST.

**A Man Horribly Mangled and Killed By An Electric Car.**

**BOX FACTORY DESTROYED BY FIRE**

**A Woman Terribly Burned by an Explosion of Stove Polish—Other Accidents.**

The Mount Shasta Manufacturing company's box factory at Shasta, Cal., was almost totally destroyed by fire on Friday night. The loss is \$10,000, the insurance \$5,000.

While entering the yards at Alameda, Cal., on Friday evening, Anthony Hoyer, aged 16, son of John Hoyer, lost his balance and fell from the car, breaking his neck in two places and dying instantly.

The salmon take a "run and jump" and try to jump the falls and get up the river. It is a curious thing for these big fish to jump twenty feet in the air in their frantic efforts to climb over the falls.

On Saturday morning at De. Higgins, Cal., on going to their pens, Hoyer and John Fitzpatrick were astonished by discovering the former thirty-five fine head sheep, and the latter twenty head of ordinary sheep, skin. The throat of the sheep had been cut. Young states that he had just been offered a head for four turkeys. News from the main herd of Young, which numbers some 3,000, is swelling with impatience. One report states that they have all been slaughtered, but this is not verified. Young's main herd is strongly guarded by a body of well armed men.

On Friday afternoon a man was run over and killed and his body horribly mangled by an electric car on the University city, at Los Angeles, Cal. It was impossible to determine from the wreckage of the car, but it is believed that the victim was a student of the University.

Frank Baudeville, who shot Perry Post, in a hard formation, says the Mount (Mont.) Miner. In the little town of Champlain, New York county, about five years ago, he attempted to entice the twenty-year-old daughter of the woman at whose house he lodged, and it was only by a "chance" that he failed in his attempt. He was arrested in the penitentiary. While the trial of the culprit was in progress at Deer Lodge, a cabin in which some of the witnesses were staying was blown up with great powder, and Baudeville, it was always thought, did the blowing.

Two men came down from Madrid, N. M., this morning to have their wounds dressed which they received last night in a fire at Griffith's saloon, says a dispatch from Los Angeles, N. M. Neither man is dangerously hurt, although the wounds are very serious. The men were drinking in the saloon when they became engaged in a quarrel. It is said Griffith drew a revolver and fired five shots at the two men, but most all made only slight flesh wounds. One man was shot in the side, but showed no signs of being hurt.

Mrs. John C. Jones was terribly burned at Leesville, Cal., on Saturday night by an explosion of stove polish. She had just placed a coal of gasoline on the stove and then covered it with a coat of stove polish. She was sitting in a chair when the explosion took place. She was terribly burned and her face was badly injured. She is now lying in the hospital, and is expected to recover.
