OBITUARY.

Died of dropsy, at her residence in Wellsville, Cache County, Utah, on the 27th day of September, 1879, at the age of 65 years, 3 months and 19 days, MARTHA HOWELL.

Deceased was a native of Aberdare, Glamorganshire, South Wales, and was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in her native town, by her husband, who had previously embraced the gospel, and had been ordained an Elder. Shortly after this Elder Howell was sent on a mission to France, and was the first to introduce the gospel in that land, and was in company with Apostle John Taylor in his celebrated discussion is "Boulogne-sur-mer." During the missionary labors of Elder Howell in France and Wales, extending through a period of three years, notwithstanding the taunts, jeers, scoffs and threats of her kindred, Sister Howell ever remained true to her beloved husband, and the noble cause which they had espoused, being willing to forsake kindred, friends, earthly honors and an unsupplied name for the gospel's sake. She emigrated from Wales to Council Bluffs in the spring of 1851, where her devoted husband died, leaving her a widow with the care of four small children on her hands. In the spring of 1852, with her family, she started to cross the plains for Utah. When about 300 miles from Kanabville her eldest son, 9 years of age, was run over by a wagon, and after lingering in great pain for the space of three days, he expired. Sister Howell continued her journey and arrived in Salt Lake City sometime in October, where she

resided 18 months, and then moved to Brigham City. In 1860 under the direction and counsel of President Brigham Young, she went back on a visit to Wales, and collected a large amount of "Royalty," on coal and iron-stone mines, which had been accumulating in her favor for several years, a very liberal portion of which went to assist the poor Saints, to gather to Zion. Shortly after her arrival in the Valley, she moved from Brigham to Wellsville, where she resided and occupied a prominent position in the Relief Society of that place up to the day of her death. Sister Howell was born of wealthy parents, who never could see the beauties of the Latter-day work but were rather inclined to ridicule and scorn, all of which she met in the true spirit of a Saint. And we must in justice say for Sister Howell, that from the day she embraced the gospel until death called her hence, her heart beat in unison and sympathy with and for the Saints; her house being always open and her hand ever ready to entertain the Elders and administer to their temporal necessities. She was a woman of sterling integrity, and unwavering faith in the ordinances of the gospel up to the last moment of her earthly existence. She has fought the good fight of faith, and now rests in peace, awaiting a glorious resurrection—COM. *Millennial Star* please copy.

Married to Josiah Miller in 1815, and embraced the gospel in the town of Holland in 1834; traveled in the Kirtland camp; came to Winter Quarters in 1840; emigrated with the first company to this country; moved to Nephi in 1850, and was one of the first settlers here. She was the mother of eight children. She leaves a son and two daughters, 56 grandchildren, 48 great grandchildren.

The funeral services took place at the residence of her son-in-law, Bishop C. Sperry, on Saturday, October 18th. After singing and prayer, etc., many of her old friends spoke of her faithfulness and long standing in the church. She has gone to meet with her husband and Joseph and Hyrum and Brigham, and those she loved. A good many followed her to her last resting place.—COM.
