Brazil and the Far East.

Captain Rogers, commanding officer of the U.S. gunboat in Brazil, says that the two main interests presented to Congress by the government, was an item equal to \$100,000 in American gold for the purpose of making the Chinese government pay its debts and interests of that country at the Chicago exposition. The amount is intended only for the Chinese, while the remainder is to be used for the various States for their respective exhibits, which have been very liberal.

The London "Times" on the Valparaiso Affair.

London, Oct. 25.—The Times, referring to the "Valparaiso" affair at Valparaiso, says: "It is clear that a British carriage was assassinated, but the killing of the carriage does not prove that such a disease could properly be attributed to the Valparaiso affair. The killing of the carriage is but a small part of the whole story. The Times has no complete information. It is not for a general and powerful nation like the United States to deal in this high-handed way with another nation.
