### TRIED TO HANG HIMSELF.

Gustavus Johnson's Insane Act in the County Jail - Will be Sent to Asylum.

Attorneys Bank Case Settled Out of Court - Southern Pacific Building Large Water Tanks.

Gustavus Johnson, a peculiar acting lodger who had been detained at the city jail several days, was last evening taken to the county jail for commitment to the state asylum at Provo. The man had hardly been at the county jail more than half an hour before he attempted suicide by hanging himself with a rope, taken from his cot to an overhead steam pipe. Sheriff Bailey happened to see him hanging and sounded the alarm. He was taken down apparently dead, his eyes glassy and black and swollen, his nose bloody and black, his face livid and his mouth black. He was taken to the hospital and was about to be killed and thought he had just as well be the killer.

The man was clearly insane and was committed to the asylum, on advice of Dr. E. L. Rich and Dr. Forbes.

### SETTLED OUT OF COURT.

The attorneys for the plaintiffs in the Citizens bank case settled their difficulty out of court yesterday afternoon after an exciting dance in the city office in which each gave his opinion on the merits of the case. It was agreed to stop litigation over the bank and to let the case go to the state court. The attorneys signed an order for the clerk to pay the cash to Albert Smith, who is the plaintiff, and to let the bank keep the balance of the cash which was turned over to Mr. Smith.

### LARGE WATER TANKS.

The Southern Pacific company is erecting two large water tanks, one at Little Mountain and one on Promontory Point, each to hold about 100,000 gallons and to be supplied from fresh springs. The tanks will insure a large supply of fresh water for use of engines and of train crews.

Hay Scarce at \$7 and \$8 per Ton - Severe Cold.

Special Correspondence. Carey, Blaine Co., Ida., Jan. 17.-Three years ago the Blaine Co. of Carey started in business with a capital of \$1,500. The following year the corporation increased its capital stock to \$2,500, and in January, 1902, declared a dividend of 25 per cent.

The following year the corporation increased its capital stock to \$10,000, and all that stock is taken up and paid for, and the corporation will again increase the capital stock. This month the concern declared a dividend of 12 per cent for the shareholders and at the annual shareholders meeting unanimously to turn in their dividends to be used for building a new and more commodious store, 30x50 feet, to cost about \$25,000.

The new store is now under construction and the directors will push the work and expect to have the new store ready for occupancy by April 1st next.

Each of the directors was re-elected with one exception. The directors also re-elected the officers who have been serving for the past year. Those are George S. Harris, president; S. P. Richards, secretary; A. B. Case, treasurer and manager.

The cold has been rather severe lately, down to 10 degrees below zero, but it does not seem to keep the children from school, which is well fitted.

Our church gatherings are interesting and all meetings very well attended.

By advice from the presidency of the stake the country lying west and north-west of here-Silver Creek, Bellevue, Hallett and Calamus valleys-has been added, temporarily, to the Blaine ward.
