The most economical mode to preserve tomatoes for family purposes is to put them into wide-mouthed jars, holding two, three, or more quarts, according to the size of the family. The tomatoes, previously to their going into winter quarters, are merely cooked without seasoning of any sort, and put while hot, into jars, which should be filled full and the cork driven home tightly and tied down. Preserved in this manner they will keep as fresh almost as when fresh picked.

The French make a great improvement in the onion, by torrefying and flattening it so as to resemble in shape, and to pack it like the fig. Burned onions are now in general use all over Europe, and no gravy soup is complete without it. The peculiar pungency which the natural onion has, leaving a long-sustained unpleasantness on the taste is entirely removed, and certain new combinations are effected by the chemistry of the oven, which commend it in most shapes to every taste, while the natural flavor is well preserved, in a subdued condition.

A gentleman in the country, who is not known more about a horse than any other man, says the Maine Farmer, "I have a horse that for a cut in the hoof with a cork of the shoe, nothing is better than to pour in melted lard and rosin, equal parts, leaving quite hot when put on. For a sprain, the best remedy is to use alcohol and beef's gall, putting one egg into a pint of alcohol, and keeping it for the purpose. Tincture of arnica, universally used for sprains, etc., is believed by him to be weakening to the system, being very penetrating in its nature, and is wholly discarded."

To make sweet pickled tomatoes cut the tomatoes through, or, if large, slice in three pieces; let them stand in weak brine over night. To a quart of vinegar add three pounds of sugar; in this cook the tomatoes until a fork can easily be passed through them. As fast as they are cooked, take them out with a fork and lay them down in a jar—say two or three layers of tomatoes; sprinkle pulverized cinnamon and cloves, and a thin layer of sugar; then alternately tomatoes, spices and sugar, cooking all the tomatoes in the same vinegar; if necessary add some sugar and vinegar. When the jar is filled cover the tomatoes with good elder vinegar or that in which the tomatoes were cooked. Lay some horse-radish root over the top of the pickles, and put a weight on to keep them covered. This recipe is equally good for ripe cucumbers.—Er.
