LIST OF LETTERS REMAINING in the Post Office at Salt Lake City, Ecby. 20, 1879, which, if not called for within one month, will be sent to grate his family comfortably to these valleys in 1851.

On his arrival in Salt Lake City President Young counseled him to settle in Southern Young counseled him to settle in Southern Utah. He was appointed first counselor to Anson Call, who was organizing a com-pany to settle Pahvan Valley, now known as Fillmore City, Millard County. He com-pleted the first dwelling house in that val-ley and there he spent twenty-five years of his life, extending hospitality to all. He was the first Probate Judge in Millard County, which office he magnified with honor many years. He was appointhonor many years. He was appoint-ed a mission to Europe April 6th 1856 where he labored until Jan. 14th, 1858, when he was notified with all the European Missionaries to return to Utah; and returned home in safety, June 25th, 1858. He served two terms in the Legislature, as


Representative of Millard County. Was President of the High PriestsQuorum of that county, also a member of the High Coun-cil. He performed a mission to the States in 186, returning the following spring. He adopted the rules of the United Order, and entered into the organization at Fillmore, and labored for its interest dilligently. Feeling his health declining, and being de-sirous of seeing his children laboring in the United Order, "ith his sons and a few 'amilles, he located in Circle Valley, Piute County; organized a branch of the United Order, May 1st, 1877. He being sustained President successfully managed the business of the peo-ple, who now number one hundred and ninty-five souls. He never seemed so hap-py as in the last few months, surrounded by his family and so many kind friends all

and 7 days He died in full faith and fellowship in the gospel of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and leaves a numerous posterity.






