Monday, May the 10th, Brother Palmer left me and started for Michigan, that being the state to which he was sent. After his departure I continued preaching in Wright County for about three weeks, and then went to Franklin County, where I continued traveling from place to place and preaching where ever and when ever I could get opportunity. I have also traveled and held many meetings in Cerro Gordo, Floyd and Butler Counties. In all these places there has been good opportunity for preaching, and on the whole we could not complain of the treatment received, nevertheless considerable opposition has been manifest, and persecution threatened; but all this has a tendency to encourage one, as we know that when the powers of darkness are uneasy, and begin to complain, there is good being done; and quite a large number in the district I have mentioned are very much interested, believing the Gospel of Christ, and who will, I think, yet join the Church.

On the 9th of this month I was joined by Elder Jensen, who was sent to Minnesota, but as there are five or six Elders in that State, and I was laboring alone in this, Elder Palmer, before leaving me, addressed a letter to the brethren, advising Brother Jensen to come and labor with me, and as soon as he could he did so.

Bro. Jensen reports the work in Minnesota as being very prosperous, seven baptisms having occurred since his arrival there, the organization of a Sunday School, and says prospects are favorable for more baptisms. Since we have been together, we have held several meetings, and enjoy a goodly portion of the Spirit of God, and although it is now a very busy time of the year, our meetings have been very well attended.

We are both young, and depend upon the Spirit of God for wisdom, in order that we may be qualified to discharge the duties that are upon us.

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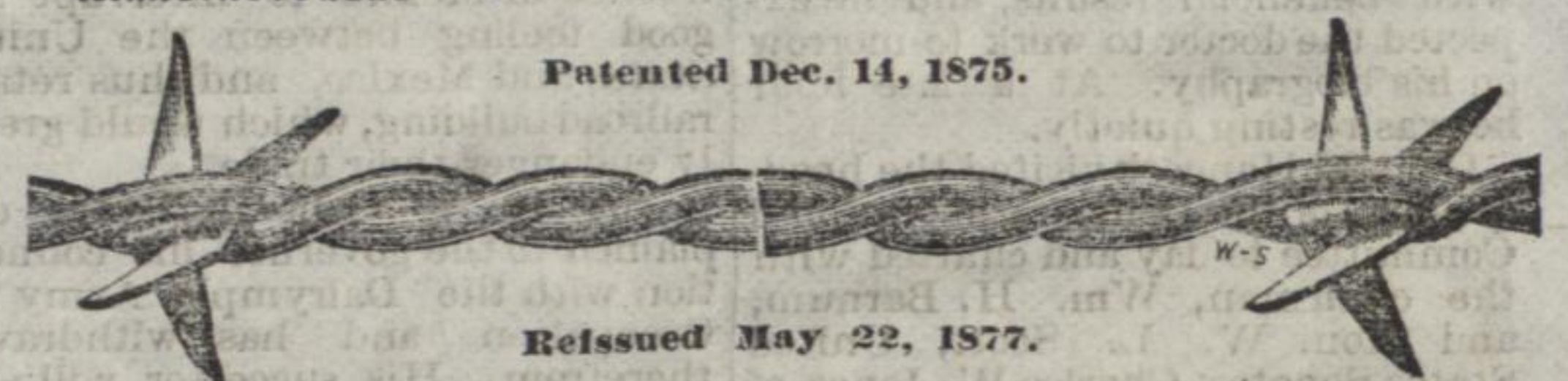
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
