during the act of emancipation, some transferred into that very body of Christ, in which he lived on earth. The announcement of a doctrine apparently so contrary to all evidence started up much antagonism, but the age in which it came was full of credulity. It appealed to the wonderful and seemed to offer an explanation of the mysterious power attributed to the Mosaic law; but more than all, it added lustre to the life administered by the consecrated servants of the church, and the result was that the doctrine of transubstantiation prevailed. It was officially approved by the council of Florence in 1439, and by the Lateran council, 1513. It was made an article of faith. The Roman church adopted the same view in 1872 at the council of Jerusalem.

At the time of the Reformation, the whole controversy was renewed. Luther held that through the power of faith, in some way not capable of explanation, the body and the blood of Christ are present in, with and under the outward elements. Zwingli taught that the sacrament is merely a commemoration of the sacrifice as the altar, the bread and wine are only symbols. Calvin endeavored to bridge the gulf by the explanation that although the bread and wine are not changed, yet the faithful receiver of these elements is brought into union with Christ through the action of the spirit and receives the power which emanates from His glorified body. The Protestants divided on this point and stood divided until this day, while the church of Rome held, it possible, a firmer stand on the foundation laid by previous councils. The Roman church emphatically will again defend the Catholic position on transubstantiation and other doctrines relating to the sacrament, precisely to that church.

There is one marked feature of the Catholic church, however, which may be more clearly brought out by the speakers at this conference—the possibility of the practice as well as doctrine of that church within certain well-understood limits. Thus, by one of the canons of the council of Trent, members of the church are allowed to believe in the sacramental doctrine of the Anglican church without the penalty of excommunication. In the same way there are churches, in their own way, in which the body and blood of Christ are not present, but which are not excommunicated. The Roman church more than other religious denominations in the world understands the importance of embodying the principle of unity in essentials, and liberty in non-essentials.

THE RARE HALL REASON.

The base ball season, which ended on Monday last, September 30th, landed ballplayers for the second consecutive time in the first place in the national league with a percentage of about 70. The Cleveland club had played an equal number of games, 130, but only won 94 as against Baltimore's 97, as the 13 percentage was rather less than 70. The club which played the largest number of games during the season was Pittsburgh, which started off with a long list of victories, but failed to keep up its record as the season advanced. The aggregation in which western athletes were most interested—that from Chicago, with Grands Amos at its head—had the good luck to finish fourth in the race, by a great margin, at the finish, after almost everybody had mentally assigned it to eighth or ninth place among the twelve competing clubs. The tall-towers are the Louisville players who have won 33 out of 123 games, while the famous Louisville performers from Boston and New York finish in the fifth and sixth places respectively.

Between the two leading clubs, Baltimore and Cleveland, there still remains the Temple City series to be decided. This is a New York trophy, apart from the regular league pennant, for which the two chief competitors do battle at the close of the regular season. The first game of this series, which consists of seven games if necessary to give the winner four of them, was played yesterday, October 2, at Cleveland, and was another in the long list of close games. Three games are booked for Baltimore next week and if the seven games shall be necessary it will probably be played at Pittsburgh.

The season just ended has been notable for its extraordinary concentration of the management of the game, and the public language followed. There have been four years when there was better playing in the last week of the season's play than in the first. The general feeling, however, was that the national game is a more popular institution, and an excitement played in an increasing of any proper enthusiasm with which young America anticipates to regard it.
