THEATRE SOLD OUT.

NEW YORK, 23.—The French theatre on Fourteenth Street, was sold out to-night. Nine horses started. The first race was won by "Copperhead," 2d, second by "Mary Davis," 2d; third by "Ginger," 2d; fourth, dead, between "Ginger" and "Davis," 2d; fifth, "Copperhead," 2d; sixth, seventh, "Copperhead," 2d. The purse was \$1,000. "Copperhead" taking \$500 "Davis" \$300 and "Slasher" \$100. This is pronounced one of the best races trotted on the Pacific coast. The big trot between "Harvest Queen," "Jas T. McMahon," "Lady Dooley," "Mary," "Dexter," "Conductor" and "Lady Dooley" for \$5,000, was run off to-day. "Harvest Queen" is a good horse.
