Washington, 14.—The House went into committee of the whole on the legislative, executive and judicial appropriation bill, the pending resolution being Randall's amendment, offered last Saturday, providing that no money shall be paid any railroad company for transportation of maticor troops while such companies are in default for interest on bonds issued by the government.


