XLIX CONGRESS.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 10.—The Chair laid before the Senate a communication from the Secretary of the Army, in reply to a resolution of a Board of Army Officers, on the subject of the site of Lake Michigan, near Chicago, in favor of the military Club of that city as a site for military purposes, and requesting legislation authorizing the Government to accept the same. Referred.

Blair, from the committee on pensions, submitted a report on 29 pension bills voted by the President, and recommended that the bills be passed notwithstanding the President's objection.

After a vigorous debate, Kenyon moved that the report of the committee be laid on the table, and the minority and all the papers be referred to the committee on pensions for consideration by that committee. A C. O. D.

The House resolution of yesterday, calling on the President for information as to the seizure or detention of American vessels in foreign ports was taken up and adopted.

The river and harbor bill was then taken up, and Mr. Blair, in support of the Hennepin Canal appropriation bill, introduced a bill for the purpose.

After a long debate by Miller, Ingalls and Palmer, without reaching a vote, the Senate went into secret session and adjourned.

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 10.—The Speaker laid before the House a message from the President announcing his disapproval of the bill granting a pension to David B. Ross. Referred to the Committee on Invalid Pensions.

Longer of Iowa, from the Committee on Pensions, submitted reports on the President's vetoes of bills granting pensions to Elizabeth Lacey and John McCarty. Ordered printed.

Harper of Pennsylvania introduced a petition signed by 150 Knights of Labor of the Fifth Congressional District of Pennsylvania in favor of legislation to promote the interests of labor.

Morrison of Indiana, from the Committee on Ways and Means, reported back adversely the Randall tariff bill. Referred to the Committee of the whole.

Brackenridge of Kentucky, from the Committee on Ways and Means, reported back adversely the Randall tariff bill. Referred to the Committee of the whole.

The amendment striking out the extra pay clause was agreed to—73 to 31.

Belmont, of New York, from the committee on foreign affairs, reported back a resolution on the subject of transmitting to the House all communications relating to the imprisonment of Edward J. Sullivan, an American citizen. Adopted.

Stone, of Missouri, from the committee on civil service reform, reported back a resolution calling on the Civil Service Board for information as to the authority under which appointments to positions within the classified civil service are made in the District of Columbia, when the proposition due to the district was less than three for the year ending Jan. 10, 1886. Adopted.

The House then resumed consideration of the general deficiency bill, the pending question being on the amendment referring to certain railroad companies. The amendment was rejected—yeas 104, nays 104.

Reagan, of Texas, took the floor to emphasize his opposition to the amendment adopted yesterday granting a salary increase to the post office employees. After considerable debate, Reagan moved to recommit the bill with instructions to the committee on appropriations to report back with an amendment striking out the extra pay clause. Agreed to, yeas 130, nays 67.

Morrison of Illinois, from the committee on ways and means, reported back adversely the Randall tariff bill. Referred to the Committee of the whole.

Burns, from the committee on appropriations, reported back a deficiency bill amended in accordance with instructions to the committee striking out the extra pay clause and striking out, 71 to 31. The bill then passed, yeas 104, nays 104.
