

COOK WILL PROFIT BY PEARY'S SUCCESS
 Offers Made For Books and Lectures at Twice Figures Previously Tendered.

CONTROVERSY WAXES WARM.
 Presence of Danish King and Queen in Expedition with the Gold Medal of Geographical Society.

Sept. 7.—A remarkable result of Commander Peary's rivalry with Cook for the discovery of the North Pole is that Dr. Cook's profits from his expedition will be largely increased. He received today offers for his books and lectures at twice the figures previously tendered. One American publisher offered \$10,000 for the rights to his story, and another offered \$5,000 for the right to publish a book about his journey.

Dr. Cook is expected to accept the offer of \$10,000. He has already received \$5,000 for the right to publish a book about his journey. He is also expected to receive \$5,000 for the right to give a series of lectures about his journey.

Dr. Cook's expedition was a great success. He reached the North Pole on September 6, 1909. He was accompanied by five men and a dog. He was the first man to reach the North Pole.

tion of the National Geographical society, which has arranged for a series of annual expeditions, this being the first. Speaking of his investigations, Prof. Tarr said:
 "I visited Hidden Glacier in 1904, and from measurements taken this year I find it has advanced two miles in three years. Generally speaking, glaciers in Alaska are receding. Some, however, fluctuate like the famous Series glacier which change every 20 years, advancing and receding. The Columbia glacier has begun to advance again."
 As proof that Alaska was once a tropical country, Prof. Tarr found Jamaica flora in coal bed formation.
 The party has been studying Malaya and other glaciers in the vicinity of Yakutat bay, as well as Childs and Miles glaciers which empty into Copper river.

BELIEVES IN COOK.
 Tacoma, Wash., Sept. 8.—Baron Kanda, one of the foremost educators of Japan, and now with the party of Japanese commissioners, believes Dr. Cook's story of the discovery of the north pole.
 "I believe he tells the truth," he said. "If we are going to enter the realm of guesswork I should throw my guess on his side."
 Baron Kanda is a graduate of Amherst college and was sent around the world by the Japanese department of education. He has charge of the department of English in the Peers college, Tokyo.

 Paris, Sept. 5.—Vere St. Ledger Gould, who, with his wife, was convicted at Monte Carlo in 1907 for the murder of Kouri Levin in order to get her jewelry, is dead at Cayenne, whether he was transported for life after his sentence of death was commuted. His wife died at Cayenne in July, 1908, from typhoid fever.

Campbell of the University of Washington, are in Alaska studying glaciers under the direction of the National Geographical Society.

Beginning Thursday morning they will return to work a thousand a day, according to a statement made tonight by C. W. Wier, chairman of the strikers' executive committee. Practically all the demands by the men, he said, have been granted.

MOUNT ROBSON CLIMBED.
 Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 8.—Mount Robson, the highest peak in the Canadian Rockies, was successfully climbed August 12, last, by Rev. George A. Kenney of Victoria, B. C., according to an announcement today. Mount Robson has an altitude of 14,000 feet and hundreds of unsuccessful attempts have been made to reach the summit.

INSTRUMENTS NECESSARY TO FIND POLE'S LOCATION.
 Chicago, Sept. 8.—A sextant, a pan of mercury, a piece of silvered glass and a spirit level are the simple appliances that would indicate with certainty the location of the pole, according to Prof. Edwin B. Frost, director of the Yerkes observatory of the University of Chicago, at Williams bay, Wis.
