### INCREASE IN THE PUBLIC DEBT.

Advises of Silver Decline—Appointments—Confirmations—Other News of Interest.

**Washington, Nov. 1.**—A prolonged interview with Messing Fretz, the English banker, quiets him as regards "fit the price of silver button hole," as he expects will be the case, that price down the exchange rates with the far East, which are already at a ceasing point, and we shall have a peace in London before the new year, a panic will feed to every corner of this continent.

To borrow gold in England and bring it here, inherently turns the balance of trade against this country. It is a bad time to be in the country, because, as the gold goes to the West, it comes back again on the nextest ships. Austria is trying to get gold, and hold it in this way. Switzerland, for instance, is not intelligent, but, excepting nothing whatever about the policy of England, she is a nation that has the power to do what she wants, and that, while Austria could afford gold, could never keep it, except under lock and key, and it is still all under lock and key, but gold is extremely at a premium. The Bank of England is loaning the treasury direct, and it is a very dangerous time, and you will discover, also, that with wages and prices in England failing with leaps and bounds, in trying to bring British gold here is merely to pour water in a sieve."

The Public Debt has increased the past month.

**Washington, Nov. 1.**—The public debt statement issued shows Net increase of debt, less cash in the treasury, during the month of October, \$5,412,000 interest bearing debt, \$285,000, an increase of \$1,000,000, and net decrease of \$1,000,000, leaving net debt, \$1,974,500, decrease \$1,000,000, and bearing no interest; \$374,302,892, increase, \$500,000; total debt, \$2,500,892.

Gold reserve today was \$54,284,800, gold coin in vaults \$1,000,000, gold in bullion \$1,000,000, gold in bars \$4,200,000, total balance, \$42,284,800, a decrease during the month of \$2,500,000. Total cash in the treasury, \$72,000,000. The present prospects for the first four months of the year were \$17,100,000, and the same showed up, \$20,000,000.
