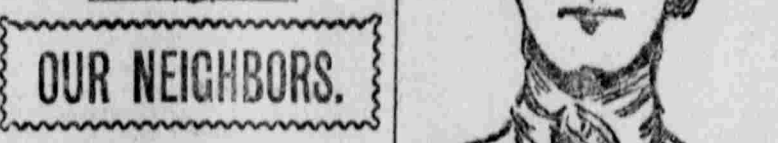
St. George, Washington Co., Oct. 16.—Walter J. Kemp, of this city, died last night from the effects of the fatal De Lamar dust.
