### EDITORIAL NOTES.

The second artesian well bored at Yankton, D. T., has developed powerful magnetic properties. A piece of steel held in the water becomes speedily magnetized.

A large number of Jews have lately passed through Brussels on their way from Russia to France, hoping to find employment there or assistance to emigrate to America.

A patent taken out in England recently stills jute in the manufacture of the so-called Wilton or Brussels carpeting, which hitherto has been made from wool.

Over 1,000 sugar houses through 27 parishes in Louisiana are now in operation. The welfare of at least 150,000 laborers depends upon the result of the present work, and \$40,000,000 of capital is awaiting the returns on the investment.

The constitutionality of the law of Congress forbidding government employees from becoming treasurers for funds raised by assessments upon other employees of the Government, has been affirmed by the Supreme Court of the United States.

Investigations recently made in the west and northwest of China show the existence of vast coal districts. The entire surface of northern China is covered with rich yellow earth to a depth of one or two thousand feet, which reveals all the coal fields.

Although the canals of New York are now free, they will hereafter remain under the control of the State, and their future prosperity will depend on their management. The Legislature will continue to have the supervision of the whole matter, and will be looked to to enact such laws as the changed state of things may require.

An English statistician calculates that out of a total revenue of £71,000,000 in Great Britain last year, £30,521,000 was paid by the class who may be called poor, £19,970,000 by the middle class, and £21,000,000 by the rich. If his figures approximate accuracy, the British poor have good reason to complain of the distribution of taxation.

Fence corners with their mass of brush and weeds, afford secure retreat for such troublesome insects as live through the winter, and for the deposit of eggs of others ready to hatch out in early spring, the larvae prepared to engage in depredations upon the first plants that appear. Fire puts an end to most of these, and thus the destroying element lessens the labor and saves the crops of the farms.

The United States Fish Commission expect the distribution of one hundred thousand young carp this fall. Since the Commission began its work, from twelve to fifteen thousand carp ponds have been stocked. Ten thousand applications for carp are now on file from different parts of the Union, and new applications are constantly received at the rate of fifty to a hundred daily.

We learn from Nature, that recently a small balloon, measuring about 100 cubic feet, and filled with pure hydrogen, was sent up at Paris by M. Mangin, a member of the Académie d'Aéronautique. A Swan incandescent light having been placed in the gas and attached to the top of the balloon, which was held captive by a rope containing two copper wires, was lighted, and the whole aerial machine, which was quite transparent, was splendidly illuminated. It was shown by experimental interruptions that the light and darkness of the Morse system could be imitated for giving military signals at a great distance.

South America will undoubtedly be the next field for railway enterprise and construction. The central portion of that continent is as yet an untouched State, and the time is approaching when it will be found profitable and necessary to connect it with the east and west coasts by railway. Descriptions of the extent and fertility of the soil, the richness and variety of the products of this wonderful territory, seem extravagant, although said to be within the truth. The valley of the Amazon alone, it is estimated, would give support to the whole population of Europe. The chances which are offered in this great continent for the United States to reap a commercial harvest are innumerable, if ordinary prudence and energy govern the attempts made to embrace them.

Some of the illuminated buoys introduced in European waters have been made to burn thirty days, and some four times that period—there is a certain class containing gas sufficient to furnish the light for one year, the flame being constant and steady night and day, and requiring no attention whatever after being once put in operation. The lanterns attached to the buoy admit air enough to feed the flame, but not a particle of water can enter. The most violent gales or the greatest force of the waves produce no effect upon the light. It burns with an undiminished brightness as long as gas is in the reservoir, and the light is so arranged, that it can be seen miles in clear weather. The refilling of the buoy is at certain intervals, which is performed by a tender, requiring but a few minutes' time. It is accomplished by simply passing the line from a storeholder, by means of a flexible tube, into the buoy.

### LET US BE THANKFUL.

To know we will be Thanksgiving Day. We are thankful for it. A day's cessation from regular labor will be a boon to many thousands of toilers. Such a rest can only be fully appreciated by those whose occupations call for steady, persistent, daily work of brain or brawn. They will be among the most grateful of the celebrators. A few holidays scattered through the year are like green and flowered spots in a thickly populated city, and are a gain instead of a loss to employers and employees.

The day will be kept in Utah as generally as in any part of this great country to which the custom of the people is so much to be thankful for. Our situation, climate, condition and surroundings are pleasant, healthful and agreeable. Our harvests have been abundant. Our business affairs have been prosperous. Our population is increasing. Our friends are becoming more numerous as we become better understood. Our enemies have fallen in all endeavors for our injury. A cloudless and serene blue sky typifies the peace which overpreads the valleys where we dwell, and the grand old mountains rear their lofty, venerable heads above and around us as tokens of the bulwarks reared by an Almighty Hand for our protection and our defense.

Let God be thanked for His mercies in every home and heart in Utah. Let His holy name be glorified. And while joy and gratitude, and thanksgiving and merriment abound, let the poor be remembered as a charge that will always be with us, to stimulate our benevolence that we may be kind and liberal even as our Eternal Father from all bounties flow.

### M. E. PECULIAR PROGRESS.

At the meeting of the general Missionary committee of the M. E. Church held in New York, when the amount of appropriations for missions of the United States to be administered as foreign missions was being considered, the Utah mission was taken up, and Secretary Fowler asked for an appropriation of \$10,000. He said he was not hopeful of Utah, because "during all the years of missionary work there, not a single Mormon had been converted by all the missionaries sent there by all the churches. They got a few of the children and once in a while a 'gentile'." The result of the debate was the appropriation of \$6,000 for the work, \$3,000 for schools, \$3,000 for the support of a school, \$2,000 to fit up a school-room, \$2,000 to complete the purchase of a lot in Salt Lake City adjoining the church and \$1,500 for work among the Scandinavians in Utah—\$12,500 in all.

If it were not for the assistance received from the East, the poor Methodist holdings of Utah would soon have to cease their ineffectual preachings. "They do not convert a single Mormon," but "they have the children and once in a while a 'gentile,'" for which success \$12,500 per annum would appear rather a large outlay. The progress of Methodism in Utah has been like the boy's winter trip to school, which landed him at home—one step forward and two slides backward. Perhaps if its scrub orators would try their lips at something else besides abuse of the "Mormons," and their hands at something besides taking up contributions, they might score a little better success. Who knows?

### ANOTHER "EDIFYING" ESCAPE.

Henry Ward Beecher has succeeded once more in court. He escaped conviction on that disgraceful criminal charge preferred against him which will not easily fade from the public memory, and now he is free from the suit for damages in which he has lately figured, for violation of his contract to write "The Life of Jesus Christ." The jury disagreed in the former case. A legal technicality saved him in the latter.

It could not be denied that the contract was made and that he received \$10,000 for the work which he did not perform. But after he had delayed it for six years, he was not formally notified that he did not proceed he would be sued for damages. Hence the failure of the case against him.

### PRESBYTERIANS IN A QUANDARY.

The subject of annulling the sick with oil, as directed by the Apostle James in his epistle to the early Saints, was broached recently by a member of the Presbyterian Church at a meeting in San Rafael, California. It created quite a commotion. The authority of the Scripture could not be denied. The injunction of the Apostle is so plain that it cannot be "spiritualized" away. The elders, not knowing how to decide, called upon the Presbytery for a ruling. But the Presbytery appeared to be equally puzzled with the elders, so they have called upon the General Assembly before any settled conclusion can be reached.

This is evidence of how much right the elders of the Presbyterian Church have to that title. It is a duty devolving upon the elders to assist the sick with oil and pray over them, that the sick may be healed. And the Apostle James lays it down as the duty of the sick to seek for the elders of the Church, to stand to this ordinance. But it appears that if sick Presbyterians follow the scriptural injunction, their elders know nothing about it.

they do not know how to attend to it, or whether they ought to do anything of the kind, and are, in fact, completely in the dark concerning the matter.

Other churches, if the truth was known, are in the same lamentable condition of ignorance concerning the ordinance for the sick and many other ceremonies belonging to the true Christian Church. And as they have no means of obtaining definite knowledge concerning them, they have to depend upon the opinions of men who are just as ignorant as themselves. This ordinance, however, with all the ordinances instituted by the Savior and his Apostles, has been restored, and they are enjoyed in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the power of God attending their administration as in times of old. To this there are thousands of living witnesses whose testimony cannot be gainsayed.

### A FEROUS CITY OF VIOLENCE.

KAUFMAN PAPERS HAVE BEEN calling attention to the crime, cowardice and general lawlessness in Cincinnati. In the month of October alone, twelve murders, eighteen shootings and cutting affairs, and nine suicides. The Providence Star remarks: "Altogether the average for the past forty days has been nearly one violent death each day in the city of pork and muscle. It is a rather remarkable showing." Cincinnati, it will be remembered, is the pious city whose religious ladies, organized into a Home Missionary Society, could find nothing better to do than set their heads to raising funds for sending out "Christian" persons to Utah to enlighten the benighted women and educate the poor children, that they might learn "how wicked are their leaders." A striking example of latter-day Phariseism, common in all the great cities of this boasted "Christian" land.

The War that for a space did Felt.

Merrill, of the St. Paul road, says he intends now to carry the railroad war into Africa. The other side shall have all the money and the demands of the Rock Island Road were unreasonable. The sale of his stock for the running week, which included the first three days of the war, only fell off \$1,000. He now proposes to make such a reduction in time to St. Paul that the Rock Island road cannot meet it; namely to leave Chicago at 8:30 a.m., and arrive at St. Paul at 9:30 a.m., thus reducing the running time six hours and overtake the necessity of sleeping cars. It is expected that other measures will follow on the other side and the war will be hotter than ever.

Cannibals of the South Seas.

SAN FRANCISCO, 23.—The schooner Rodolph, which arrived at Brisbane from the South Seas, reports that when recruiting for islanders the boats were frequently fired upon. A number of unarmed natives were captured and eaten by the inhabitants of Samoa and Aps. The Tongan islanders also boarded the schooner Rodolph and invited the recruits to seize the vessel and the natives were killed, and three of the mariners killed.

Supreme Suits.

WASHINGTON, 23.—The counsel for Rev. Harvey who was convicted here yesterday of using the United States mails for defrauding, will raise a question of the constitutionality of the law and take the case to the supreme Court of the United States.

A committee of the citizens of Yankton county prepared a memorial to Congress asking that authority be given to the State to issue bonds to redeem the present bonded debt and get a small grant of land to help pay the debt. It is hoped the bill will be put through this session.
