EVENTS IN THE WEST.

A Record of Occurrences in Neighboring States and Territories.

HIGH CONTRACT FOR CALIFORNIA FRUITS.

A Flimsy Committee Sidelined—Arrest of a Ship's Captain—Fatal Shooting at Fort—Miscellaneous.

The steamer *Albatross* sailed last Tuesday night from Seattle, Wash., for Port Valdez, Alaska, via Tula and Skagway with 250 passengers.

For the meeting of the Western Federation of Miners to be held in Salt Lake commencing May 15th, the Colorado Territorial Labor Boarder Association has voted a rate of one and one-half fare from Salt Lake to Colorado points.

George Smith, a flimsy on the steamer *Excelsior*, committed suicide early this (Wednesday) morning by jumping himself in the bay at Seattle, Wash. For a long time Smith had exhibited signs of mental derangement, especially on the subject of shipwrecks.

The Wyoming Republican committee, at a meeting held from Seattle, Wash., decided that it would be best for the party to abandon the advocacy of the free coinage of silver and adopt the St. Louis platform. Action to this end will be taken at the party's forthcoming convention.

The American steamer *Valencia*, Capt. Lord, has arrived at San Francisco from Baltimore. She will be put on the Copper River route by the Pacific Steam Whaling Company. The steamer is an iron-hulled steamer of about 1,600 tons, and will start on her first trip north on March 3.

The Keeney company, made up principally of people of Bradstock and Beaver Falls, Pa., has been in the Allegheny, intending to go into the Copper River country. The party numbers twelve, and is in charge of C. C. Keeney, who took a party of miners into the interior of Alaska eleven years ago.

An affray in which two men were killed took place at Sacramento, fifteen miles north of San Diego, Cal., Sunday night. From all accounts it appears that the parties to the affray were Russian. One of the men was killed by a bullet in the chest, and the other was killed by a bullet in the head. The bodies of the victims were found by a party of miners who were in the vicinity.

L. B. Dennis Royce, an electrical engineer, died Sunday at 11 A. M. of a heart attack at 23 Mission Street, San Francisco. Three of the shots took him down. He was a married man, and had a family. He was a well-known electrical engineer in the city.

Captain Murphy of the ship *Guineo* has been arrested on the charge of maltreating an apprentice named John. The apprentice was taken to the Good Samaritan hospital at Portland, Ore. Captain Murphy's first mate, Harvey, was arrested on the same charge and both cases are now pending in the United States district court.

Collective of the San Francisco port Jackson, and United States Agents have addressed a letter to the secretary of the treasury for the purpose of advising him in checking the flood of cheap Oriental goods that are being shipped to this country under stamps which give them the appearance of having been manufactured in European countries, and which are sold at prices which are driving the domestic articles out of the market.

Heinrich Haas, representing one of the largest mercantile houses in Hamburg, Germany, has signed a contract for California dried fruits to be delivered during the coming season. The price to be paid will exceed \$400,000, making it the largest single sale of California products ever made by a European firm. Hamburg being a free port of entry, is a distributing center, and the fruit which goes to be sent throughout Germany, Denmark and Norway and Sweden.

The Klondike boom has done more for San Francisco than merely to increase the volume of business and direct Alaska-bound travel through the port. It has, directly and indirectly, by the police department, sent as fine a lot of trouble as ever visited a frontier city.
