"NIHILISM IN RUSSIA."

Mr. William J. Armstrong of Wash-ington, D. C., delivered a very effec-tive and instructive lecture on Satur-day evening, at the Sait Lake Theatre. Hissubject was "Nthilism in Russla." There was not the audience present which the theme deserved. But that was no doubt owing to defective adver-For instance the lecture was tizing. not advertized in the DESERET NEWS and as that paper circulates among all classes who would most likely pat-ronize an intellecual treat, such as the lecture really was, the reason of the thin attendance is evident.

Mr. Armstrong commenced his lec-ture with a be utiful tribute to the father's of our republ c, and to the sys-tem of government established by them. By that work a new political creed was heralded to the world. It caused crowne, monarchies, and oligarchies to shake in their foundations. With one solitary their foundations. exception the governments of the world have been more or less reformed, and in the majority of cases revolutionized since the Declaration of American Independence was written. Russia is the sole and monstrous excep-tion. She still stands the same unrelenting foe to human liberty, that

she was a thousand years ago. Russia, continued the speaker, is the direct opposite with our govern-ment in every particular. Russia is dead to all instincts of popular rights. She pitles not the oppressed. Humanity has not a single right which her ruler feels bound to respect. And yet we are told that fraternal feelings exist between that country and our Republic; that toasts have been drunk and praises sung in mutual felicitations and that even now in the office of the Secretary of State, ready to be transmitted to the United States Senate, is the draft of a treaty agree-ing that accused offenders of the two nations shall be affectionately exchanged.

Mr. Armstrong then fully explained how the unholy and false association of the names of Abraham Lincoln and Alexander II had come about. It was simply because of the emancipation of Russian series by the Czar. This act was not personally the work of Alexander II. For nearly a hundred years every Russian monarch who preceded Alexander contemplated doing this work, but Alexander seeing that the safety of Russian despotism demanded it, at once issued the ukase which man-umitted the serfs. This, said the lec-turer, was the true 'story of an act which coupled the names of Lincoln and the Czar of Russia.
