MINUTES

Of the Salt Lake County Educational Association, held January 6th, 1882, at the Council House, commencing at 7 o'clock, p.m., President T. B. Lewis, Presiding.

It being the evening for the election of officers, the meeting proceeded with that business with the following result: President, T. B. Lewis; First Vice President, T. F. Howell; Second Vice President, L. W. Snow; Secretary, H. B. Barton; Treasurer, Miss Nellie Mantle.

The subject of consolidating the school districts was then presented by Prof. Lewis.

M. Young, wished to know if the consolidation would be a step toward free schools? He spoke of some schools being free, and others not so, which he thought had a bad effect. Prof. Lewis, said he thought it could answer the affirmative. The power, which is now given to so many trustees, few of whom it can be said attend to their duties, would then be given to a few, who would have to attend more closely to the interests of the schools.

On motion of J. M. Young, the subject of consolidating the school districts was laid over till next meeting.

T. F. Howell showed the necessity of teachers being moral examples, so that they might demand the respect of all.

L. W. Snow wished to know to what extent pupils should be required to prepare their lessons?

F. Kessler thought it hard to give definite rules for such pupils. He had found such in every school, and thought that if they could not be subdued in any other way, corporal punishment should be used.

W. Van Cott said he had noticed a great lack of thoroughness in pupils, and unless they are thorough in their studies they will not be interested. He thought it best to be strict on all points, and never let them be late in the morning, at recess, to their classes, or at any time. Keep them right up to their duties in all things, and by so doing, they will be made to think, and they will love their studies more and prepare them better.

A. L. Thompson also made some very good remarks on government. He thought it well to appeal to the honor of the pupil as much as possible.

After which President Lewis said he could endorse the remarks of Brother Van Cott, for he knew that if you once get a pupil to think, it will be no trouble to get him to learn.

It was moved that when the association adjourned, it do so for one week, to meet at the same time and place.

On Motion of W. Van Cott, the secretary was instructed to furnish the News, Herald and Territorial Superintendent with a copy of these minutes.
