

suggestion to the Assembly; there was only a few minutes time to decide, and as no member could object to the name of Garfield, the change was made. Hon. Erastus Snow being the first to support it. We have every reason to believe that the Governor would have signed the bill on seeing the people's petitions for the organization of the County, without the change of its name. In this we have the endorsement of Mr. Dalton.

We must say that Governor Murray has, in our opinion, acted on his convictions, in his course with the Assembly which has just dissolved. We consider him very much mistaken in some things, but he has presented his objections in a gentlemanly and dignified manner, with nothing offensive in language or tone. Many changes suggested by him were beneficial, and were at once adopted by the Assembly. He signed most of the bills presented for his consideration. A few, among them the new Salt Lake City charter, were sent to him too late for fair examination and were therefore not signed; the blame for this cannot properly be laid to his charge. He worked hard all day and all night of Thursday and all day on Friday, giving to every measure brought to his attention, careful and, as far as he could, unbiased consideration. The Secretary is also deserving of commendation while officiating as acting Governor and also in his usual capacity.

There are many new laws worthy of mention, which we have not space to-day to notice. The Assembly has performed effective service, and the relations of the two Houses have been cordial, although some measures originating in one have been slain in the other and vice versa. The members separated with the very best and warmest sentiments towards each other, and with the pleasant satisfaction of having labored faithfully for the best interests of the people according to their light and ability. We believe the public will endorse their endeavors.

LITTLE COLORADO STAKE CONFERENCE.

The Quarterly Conference of the Little Colorado Stake of Zion, convened at Sunset, on the 25th and 26th of February, 1882. There were present the Presidency of the Stake,

Bishops of all the Wards but one, High Councillors, Presidency of the High Priest Quorum and others. President Jesse N. Smith, of the Eastern Arizona Stake was also in attendance.

Saturday, 10 a. m.

After opening exercises, President Lot Smith remarked upon the few members and scattered condition of the settlements in this Stake, upon the uneasiness of the human family, and the proper education of our children.

Bishop L. M. Savage then reported Sunset Ward, and Bishop A. L. Farnsworth, the Moan Copy Ward. Closing prayer by Elder W. Black.

2 p. m.

After the usual opening exercises Bishop J. H. Richards reported St. Joseph Ward, and President J. N. Smith gave an interesting account of his early experience in the settlement of Salt Lake Valley. Two of the members of the High Council were set apart by the Presidency of the Stake. Closing prayer by Elder D. Seegmiller.

Sunday, 10 a. m.

After the usual opening exercises, Elder F. G. Nielson presented the general authorities of the Church as sustained at the last Semi-Annual Conference held in Salt Lake City, who were sustained by a numerous vote. He also presented the authorities of the Little Colorado Stake, who with the home and Lamanite missionaries were unanimously sustained. He then read the statistical report of the Stake, for the quarter ending February 15th, 1882, showing that there was a total of 60 families in the Stake, 152 children under eight years, and a total of 392. The Tonto Basin Ward was not reported. The statistical report of Sunday schools for the quarter ending December 31st, 1881, was also read, showing a total of officers, teachers and pupils in three schools reported of 144. Two schools were not reported.

Elder Samuel H. Rogers then occupied the time in speaking upon the redemption of Zion, and being plain in our dress.

Closing prayer by Elder T. W. Brookbank.

2 p. m.

After opening exercises, sacrament was administered.

Elder Thos. W. Brookbank spoke upon the ushering in of the dispensation opened up by the Prophet Joseph Smith, and the persecutions that are sought to be heaped upon this people.

President J. N. Smith spoke upon the blessings promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and their seed; and that those blessings were extended unto us through faithfulness. The practice of the principles of truth and virtue would bring us happiness.

Bishop A. L. Farnsworth and Elder H. K. Perkins bore their testimonies.

President Lot Smith made a few closing remarks, and adjourned the conference until the 27th of May, 1882.
