This insures the nomination of Randall for speaker of the Forty-sixth congress on the first ballot.

THE REPUBLICAN CAUCUS. The vote for clerk of the House resulted: Adams, 76; Caldwell, 1. The present incumbents were nominated for sergeant-at-arms and door-keeper, respectively, by acclamation. The republican representatives at caucus, this afternoon, unanimously nominated the following candidates for the elective offices of the House: Speaker, General Garfield; clerk of the House, ex-Congressman Rainey, South Carolina; sergeant-at-arms, Jeremiah M. Kink, Wisconsin; door-keeper, James Melton, Tennessee; paymaster general, Harry Sherwood, Michigan; chaplain, Dr. Naylor, of the Methodist Episcopal church.

CAUCUS OF DEMOCRATIC SENATORS. The democratic senators resumed their caucus, to-day, and extended till to-morrow afternoon, the report of the committee on the membership of standard committees. The matter of the ballot for officers of the Senate was deferred till Thursday. Senator Beck offered a resolution providing in substance that the legislative business of the Senate during the extra session shall be confined to the passage of the annual appropriation bills which failed last session, including the political measures incorporated by the House of Representatives, viz., the repeal of the federal election laws, and the repeal of the general land laws.

THE OLIVER-CAMERON CASE. The case of Mary S. Oliver against Simon Cameron for \$50,000 damages for breach of promise of marriage, came up in the circuit court to-day. The plaintiff testified that in 1876 Cameron proposed marriage to her, and she accepted. Three letters from Cameron were introduced, one of them closing with the sentence, "You will be my wife." Cameron did not come to the house where she lived, as he said that people there did not like him. She has been quite often in this city. He would come from Harrisburg once in every two weeks until Congress met, and then he would come to the committee room. There were improper privileges taken with her by Cameron during the existence of the case. Adjudged.

THE TENEMENT HOUSE REFORM. NEW YORK, 17.—The House to-day on the tenement house reform which is now largely engaging the attention of prominent men here, says people who have been shocked by tales told by the police of overcrowding in Chinese quarters. San Francisco will do well to consider the description given in this paper of the tenement region in New York, in which 750 people are packed so densely that the average space occupied by a whole tenement family is 10 feet by 10 feet, while the average space allotted them to sleep in is 8 feet by 10.

THE CASTLE EXPORTATION TRADE. A petition in relation to the capture of the ship "The Castle" by the British gunboat "Osprey," now at Sitka, is received here by telegraph via Victoria. He describes the situation at length, showing that the British gunboat "Osprey," of 310 tons, is a vessel of the British navy, and is now on the coast of Alaska, where she is engaged in the exportation of furs and other goods to the British Isles.

UNITED STATES SHIPPING COMMISSIONER. STEVENSON, to-day, met the board of directors of the United States Shipping Commission, and discussed the collection of blood money by sailors from the United States, which has recently been revived. The chief of police has taken steps to cause the arrest of all runners attempting to board ships on entering the harbor.

PHILADELPHIA, 17.—The committee recently appointed by the city council to investigate the arrangements for a proper reception to Grant upon his return to-day. The chairman explained that free transportation for the president and his family would be given to the city of Philadelphia, and that the city would be responsible for the expenses of the trip.

FEARFUL TALES OF DISTRESS. SEBASTIEN, 17.—The lowest estimate now current fixes the number of drowned at 2,000. Many believe that 4,000 perished, as the gale prevented the majority of the inhabitants from leaving the city. Some of the largest houses fell on Saturday, and one is said to have overwhelmed 80 (probably eight) persons, and another 50 persons. To-night many people are still on the roofs of houses and in trees. Diphtheria has broken out among the fugitives in Sebege. Sixteen thousand horses and cattle and 90,000 sheep have been lost. The water falls very slowly, only receding three inches on Saturday night. Fearful tales are told of individual deaths. Women on board the rescuing steamers refuse to part with the corpses of their children. The refugees on the embankments are eating seed corn. Accoutrements are taken from the boats and on railway trucks.

THE EMPEROR VISITS THE RUSSIA. The Emperor Francis Joseph arrived to-day, and was conveyed in a boat to the ruined town. About 25,000 inhabitants have been removed, while those remaining are amply supplied with provisions. The Emperor, replying to an address, said his heart was deeply pained at the calamity which had befallen the inhabitants. The people mourned the measure, and help would come. The Emperor was greatly affected. He started for Vienna this evening.

GERMANY. FEELING STATE OF SIEGE. BERLIN, 17.—The Reichstag, to-day, discussed the report explanatory of the action of government in instituting a petty state of siege. Herr Liebnicht, socialist, strongly censured the measure, and said that the Reichstag, which he pronounced wholly unnecessary, was a party of reform, not of revolution. He defended the course of the socialist deputies in not rising from their seats when cheers were given to the Emperor. The president of the Reichstag, amid cheers, remarked that this conduct offended the moral sense of the chamber. Herr Liebnicht continued: "If a republic is established in Germany"—He was unable to finish the sentence in consequence of the uproar which his words caused. The president threatened to deprive him of his right of speech.

COUNT VON EULENBURG. Count von Eulenbure explained that his government's reason for claiming a state of siege was that Berlin was in great danger, because it was the home of socialist agitation.
