Apricots are cleaning up, with choice quoted at 8%%79, extra choice at 9½ 4%9½, and fancy at 10½%710½. Prunes seem to be attracting compar-atively little demand for forward ship-ment from the coast, but the arrivals here have been light and the market holds steady, with quotations ranging from 4 to 13 for California and from 6½ to 7½ for Oregon, latters 80s to 30s. Peaches are firm, with choice quoted at 7%71½, extra choice at 7% 68, and fancy at 8½%614, choice to fancy seed-ed at 5½%614, choice.
