Statement of the Prosecution in the
Nelson Murder Case.—Safes.

Provo, April 4.—The jury panel in the Peter J. Nelson case was empaneled yesterday afternoon. The names of the jury are as follows: S. D. Johnson, Nepti R. Indred, J. H. Williams, David Faxon, James H. McDonald, Calvin Cragan, P. C. Peterson, S. H. Belmont, John R. Morgan, William Roylance, John W. Walter and Thomas L. Mordeson.

Jack Johnson stated that the prosecution expected to prove the following statement of facts: On and between December 19th, Peter J. Nelson and his father, Peter J. Nelson, were employed at the Mt. Pleasant bank. On the evening named they left the bank, going to their homes, a distance of six or seven blocks, and the deceased subsequently to his mother's house, a block further. The defendant returned to the bank during the evening to prepare a financial statement of the bank. While the deceased was seated at his mother's house, a shot was fired from the west side of the house, passing through the house and striking him. The old lady rushed out and gave the alarm. Several witnesses came to and found deceased lying on the floor with a wound in his left breast. In the bank was kept a Browning rifle, which had been cleaned a week or ten days before the shooting, and a day or two before, had been taken to a gunsmith by defendant, and the night before the gun had been cleaned. It was customary for the night and a light burning in the building, but on the night in question, a power by accident had been cut, and the lights were down, and that the light was not in its accustomed place. This was at 2:15 o'clock, and shortly after the power was restored, and the lights were again burning, and saw Nelson after he had been shot. Traces were found in the early morning, leading up to a point near the window, where it appeared as though the person had leaned forward on the left foot. The defendant made several conflicting statements concerning the loading of the gun. He refused to give up the bank keys until an imperative demand was made for them by an officer. When the breach of the gun in the bank was thrown open, there were signs of freshly burned powder, and there were other evidences that the gun had been recently fired. The ball which struck Nelson was the same caliber as the gun. Nobody had keys to the bank except defendant and deceased. After the shooting, someone went to the bank and informed Nelson of the fact. Nelson went with the police to the scene of the shooting, but did not ask any questions concerning the rifle.
