## **SECOND DISTRICT COURT.**

An Editor Arrested on a Charge of Libel—Unlawful Cohabitation Cases.

BEAVER, Dec. 17th, 1897.—[Special to the *Deseret News*.]—A case of libel was tried at the Second District Court today, on Wednesday last, of Charles S. King, editor of the *Frederic Times*, on an indictment having been found by the late grand jury charging him with criminal libel. The alleged libel is said to consist of a series of editorial articles in the defendant's paper reflecting upon the integrity of the judge and prosecuting attorney in their conduct of the trial of Andrew Calton, the slayer of Mike Quinn. King is the same individual who was arrested and feathered in Ogden some eight or nine years ago, at which time he was conducting a newspaper known as the *Morning Herald*. He will plead to his indictment on Monday.

Nothing at all is being done in the District Court today, witnesses in the Stewart case having not yet arrived. It is understood that Stephen Barton, of Paragonah, who is under bonds on an indictment for unlawful cohabitation, will be here on Monday and withdraw his former plea of not guilty, plead guilty and receive sentence, he will accompany Messrs. Clendenen, Stearns, Macfarlane and Holyoak on their journey to the penitentiary.

## **Divorce Set Aside.**

The hearing in the case of Sarah Ann Bassett vs. Wm. E. Bassett was concluded before Judge Zane today. The plaintiff asked that the decree of divorce granted by the Probate Court in January, 1896, prior to the defendant's second marriage, be set aside, and that she be reinstated as the defendant's wife and be paid \$40 per month alimony and \$100 attorney's fees.

The plaintiff went off the witness stand and told how, when she received a summons to answer to the Probate Court in the matter of divorce, instituted by her husband, she came to this city, and with threats of prosecuting him for polygamy, got him to promise to withdraw the suit. She said she "knew him his choice, five years in the penitentiary or the withdrawal of the suit." Her manner throughout plainly indicated her animosity to the defendant.

The court granted the application to set aside the decree of the Probate Court, and ordered that the defendant pay \$100 attorney's fees within ten days, and \$30 per month alimony from Dec. 1st, as an appeal will be taken to the Supreme Court.

## **THE FREE SCHOOL MOVE.**

For the Twelfth District Rejected by a Vote of 28 to 13.

At the meeting in the Twelfth District schoolhouse last evening there was a good turnout of resident taxpayers, to vote upon the proposition of establishing a free school and the levying of a special tax to defray the expense. The meeting was called pursuant to a resolution adopted at a meeting held at the schoolhouse on Monday evening, and was presided over by Henry T. McEwan, secretary of the meeting. After the call had been read, stating the object of the meeting, William McKay raised the objection that it would be illegal to vote upon a tax, as that was not specified in the call as one of the objects of the meeting. Considerable discussion followed and the chairman decided that the only question to be acted upon was whether the school should be made free, but stated that the tax of one-fourth of one per cent, which the trustees are authorized by law to levy without calling a meeting, would be sufficient to defray the additional expense of making the school free.

Mr. J. H. Midgley said he had lived many years in the district, had served as a trustee, patronized the school liberally and assisted in elevating it to the degree of excellence it has reached. The school was now in good running order, and he did not desire to disturb matters and inaugurate radical changes when it was giving such good satisfaction. The tuition was light and he saw no necessity of increasing the taxes of the people
