

NEXT WEEK IN HISTORY.

FEBRUARY 3.
1805—Albert Sidney Johnston, Confederate general, born in Mason county, Ky.; killed at Shiloh 1862.
1807—Joseph Eggleston Johnson, Confederate general, born near Farmville, Va.; died 1891.
1811—Horace Greeley born in Amherst, N. H.; died 1872.
1874—Lunalilo VI, King of Hawaii, died in Honolulu; born 1835.
1894—George William Childs, proprietor of the Philadelphia Ledger, died in Philadelphia; born 1829.
1900—General W. W. Averell, noted Federal cavalry leader during the Civil war, died at Bath, N. Y.; born 1832.
FEBRUARY 4.
1840—The United States bank, an institution chartered by Pennsylvania after it had been abolished by government action, suspended finally. Its entire capital had been sunk.
1881—Thomas Carlyle, "writer of books," died in Cheyne row, Chelsea, where he had lived over 40 years; born in Scotland 1795.
1890—Antoine Marie Philippe Louis d'Orleans (Duke of Montpensier) died in San Lúcar, Spain; born 1824, fifth son of King Louis Philippe of France.
1899—Beginning of the struggle between American troops and natives of the Philippine Islands.
1901—Centennial anniversary of the installation of John Marshall as chief justice of the United States celebrated throughout the Union. Funeral of Queen Victoria.
FEBRUARY 5.
1732—John Witherspoon, "signer," born in Haddingtonshire, Scotland; died 1794.
1725—James Ogle, patriotic orator and writer, born at West Barnstable, Mass.; killed by lightning May 22, 1783.
1757—Battle of Plassey and victory of Lord Clive, which made Great Britain ruler of India.
FEBRUARY 6.
1778—France officially acknowledged independence of United States and promised an alliance, a decisive event in the Revolution.
1813—William Maxwell Evans, distinguished American lawyer, born in Boston.
1896—General John Gibbon, U. S. A., retired, noted veteran of the Civil war, died in Baltimore; born 1828.
1899—Caprioli, ex-chancellor of the

1907—Pasquale Paoli, Corsican general and patriot, died in London; born 1726. Paoli led his countrymen in a long struggle for independence against Genoa. The island was finally sold to France, and it was owing to French occupation of his native land that Napoleon Bonaparte was educated in France. Napoleon at one time was an ardent Corsican patriot and a political disciple of Paoli.
1905—Diplomatic relations broken off between Russia and Japan. Dr. Felix Phugel, famous German scholar and philologist, died in Leipzig; born 1826.
1906—Countess Boni de Castellane, nee Anna Gold, entered a plea for divorce in the French courts.

FEBRUARY 7.
1807—Battle of Eylau, bloody, but indecisive. Bonaparte against the Russians and Prussians. Napoleon had defeated the Prussian forces at Jena in October, 1806, and marched eastward as far as Moscow to meet the Russian army which, under Alexander I, led against the French in order to succeed his ally, King Frederick of Prussia. Over 50,000 combatants fell in the battle of Eylau, which was fought in a blinding snowstorm. Napoleon maintained his position in Poland and subsequently defeated Alexander at Friedland.
1841—The United States bank failed for the second time, causing panic and depression.
1876—Admiral Sir H. Stringham, U. S. N., distinguished in all the wars from 1812 to 1861, died in Brooklyn; born at Middleton,

German empire, successor to Bismarck, died in Frankfurt; born 1831.
1904—The long awaited reply of Russia to Japan's note with reference to Manchuria and Korea forwarded to Tokyo by the Russian viceroy in the far east, Alexeeff.

FEBRUARY 8.
1725—Peter the Great, Russian reformer and ideal monarch, died; born 1672. Peter I, of Russia, founded St. Petersburg.
1820—William Tecumseh Sherman, soldier, born in Lancaster, O.; died 1891.
1894—Colonel John R. Baylor, a noted Texan pioneer and Indian fighter, also an officer of the Confederate states, died near San Antonio; born 1822.
1902—Vice Admiral Montijo, commander of the Spanish fleet at the battle of Manila, died at Madrid; born 1831.
1904—Outbreak of hostilities between Russia and Japan.
1905—A pact revising and amending the convention of Jan. 20, 1905, between the United States and Santo Domingo signed at Santo Domingo.

1904—The most destructive fire in the history of Baltimore laid in ruins 140 acres in the heart of the city; loss, \$50,000,000.
1906—Paul Mettenrich, son of Prince Mettenrich, the Austrian minister who was hostile to Napoleon I, died in Vienna; born 1822.

FEBRUARY 9.
1773—General William Henry Harrison, ninth president of the United States, born in Charles City county, Va.; died in Washington city 1841.
1822—James Parton, American author, born in Canterbury, England; died 1891.
1884—Cetewayo, the Zulu chieftain who fought the English in South Africa in 1879, died. Cetewayo put 20,000 blacks in the field. He personally led at the battle of Isandhawa, where the British were slaughtered, in January, 1879. The Boers were neutral during the Zulu war.
1886—General Winfield Scott Hancock, distinguished Federal leader, died on Governors island, New York bay; born 1824.
1894—Maxime du Camp, a noted French author, died at Paris; born 1829.
1904—Night attack by the Japanese fleet at Port Arthur. The United States addressed an identical note to the powers suggesting that the neutrality and integrity of China be maintained by Russia and Japan.
