

CITY WILL HAVE NINE MILL LEVY

Probable That It Will be the Same As Last Year.

AUDITOR REISER'S ESTIMATE

Says It Will Require \$314,718.23 to Meet Running Expenses—Sharp Changes His Mind.

The city tax levy for the year ending Dec. 31, 1903, will in all probability be fixed at 9 mills, which is the same as last year. According to the report of the city's receipts and estimated expenditures as submitted to the city council last evening by City Auditor Reiser it will require a total of \$314,718.23 to be raised by taxation to meet the running expenses of the city. In order to raise that amount it will be necessary to make a levy of 9 mills. The council will meet in an adjourned session on Wednesday evening and fix the levy. The report submitted by Auditor Reiser was referred to the finance committee, which will report to the council Wednesday evening. The report of estimated expenditures does not include the South Temple street paving nor the Parley's canyon storage reservoir, which improvements are yet in an unsettled stage. SEATS FOR PIONEER PARK.
