The Rev. Aloisius L. Blaznik enjoys the distinction of being the first Slavonic priest to be ordained in the Catholic church in New York.

Five years ago Archbishop Corrigan of that diocese decided that the Slavs living in the metropolis were entitled to ecclesiastical representation. He sent a priest to Austria for the purpose of selecting a candidate. The choice fell on Blaznik, a wealthy merchant of Liabach, Austria. The elder Blaznik and his wife were witnesses of their son's ordination which took place in St. John's church, New York City, last week.

NEW GOVERNOR OF OHIO.

The death of Gov. Patterson, of Ohio, last week wrests control of that state from the Democratic party. The accession of Lieut. Gov. Andrew L. Harris, a Republican, who succeeds him, will give the Republicans the benefit of the patronage of the state institutions in which thousands of Republicans are office holders. Gov. Patterson's long illness prevented him from ousting the Republican officeholders, so the state Republican organization is practically intact.

Gen. Andrew L. Harris, the new governor, was born in Ohio and is a veteran of the Civil war.

"Well," said the second, "we had better get back home to bed before we are run in."

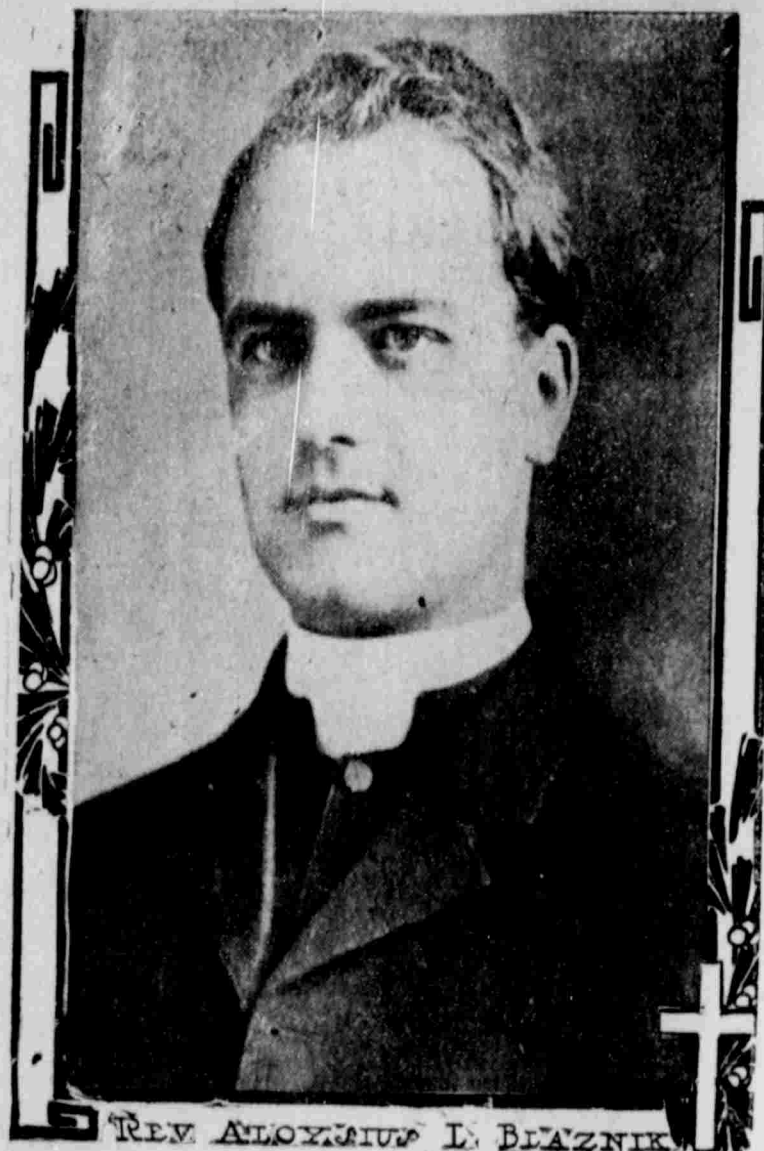

"Did the gentlemen feel last night's slight earthquake shock?"—Los Angeles Times.

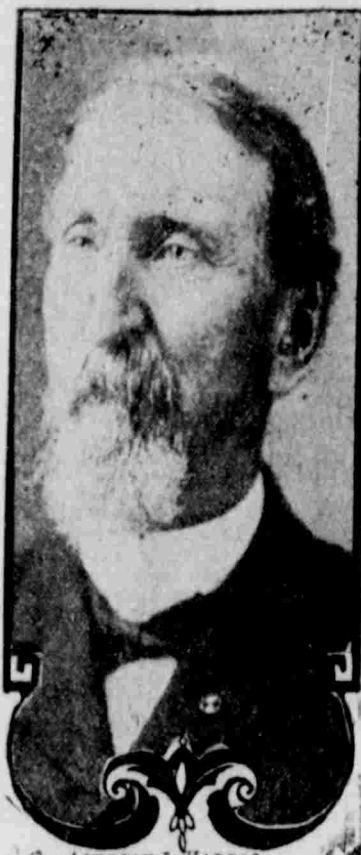

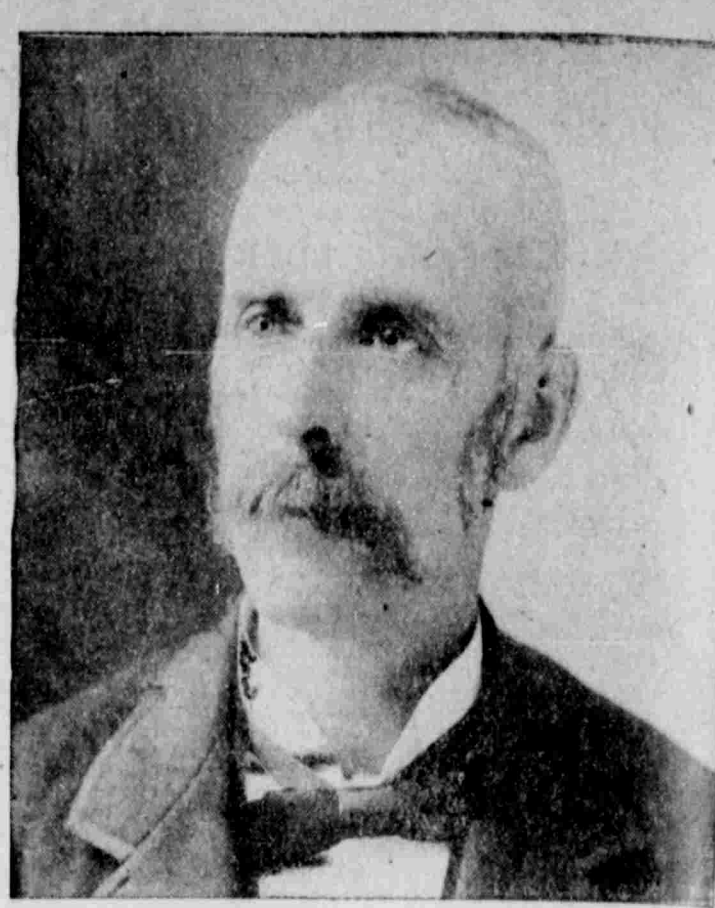
