A New York Institution.

Curious paper, that New York *Herald*. Its characteristics are incongruous. Sensation is its staff of life, and bananahs to the New York *Herald* its daily and everlasting theme. Just as this paper did some time ago, it concluded their doings. The Stanley expedition tried their patience excessively. For a matter of months the *Herald* "allusions" to Stanley, and the difficulties of passes, and the want of it was, the young compeers blocked up the Atlantic cable, besides monopolizing most of the American press outside of the *Herald*.
