Apprehensions of the approach of cholera are becoming less alarming, in view of the measures which are being taken for its prevention. The opinions of the leading physicians are being sought on the subject, but in the search made yesterday, but two out of ten leading doctors were found, the others being out of term. The Staten Island ferry boat Middletown, commenced running yesterday. After the explosion of the Westfield the Middletown was laid up for repairs, but the people believe her still unsafe, and have made complaints against the company because they have allowed the boat to be replaced on the line.

TOPEKA, 17.-Next Thursday was fixed for the execution of Mrs. Scales and young Ford, for the murder of the former's husband. At a late hour last night a message was received from the Governor commuting the sentence to imprisonment for life, and the prisoners were removed to the penitentiary at once. There is much surprise at the action of the Governor, as the Judge and jury refused to sign petitions for the commutation, and the prisoners confessed the crime, which was of an aggravated character.

PORTLAND, Oregon. - The commission sent to the Umatilla reservation failed to induce the Indians to part with their lands and remove to another reservation. On a final declaration of the chiefs on Saturday evening that they would not relinquish their right to the Umatilla reservation, the council terminated. The Indians say the former treaties have not been carried out on the part of the whites, and the lands offered were too poor to raise corn and did not suit them. COPENHAGEN, 14. - Precautionary measures have been adopted and are to be enforced by government, to prevent the introduction of cholera into the country.

A number of Prussian troops became involved in a quarrel with the inhabitants, and a fight ensued, during which numbers of both parties were killed and wounded.

It is stated on authority that serious disagreements have arisen between the French and German governments with tiation. The present difficulties are likely to lead to further complications, which may result in a suspension of the treaty of peace negotiated between the governments at Frankfort.

OTTAWA, 15.-It is now positively asserted that the Marquis of Lorne and the Princess Louise will take up their residence here for a lengthened period. The Governor-General's residence is being prepared for their reception.

In consequence of the Washington Treaty, considerable reduction is expected to be made in the militia force. PARIS, 15 .- To-day, being the annigin, was observed as a holiday here and at Versailles.

Advices from Paris say the city is excited, and the situation threatening. Trouble is apprehended from various sources. To-day is the fete of Napoleon the first, and the air is full of rumors that the army will revolt against the Versailles Assembly, declare McMabon Regent and demand the Empire. The people are leaving Paris in a stampede, and some believe that the Orleanists' scheme is ripe for a coup de etat, heing pushed by the proposition to make Thiers permanent executive, which it is feared would establish a government not monarchical. Thiers has no friends; he is hated by Republicans, Royalists and Imperialists alike. A crisis is approaching.

FLORENCE, 16.—Garibaldi is very ill, and his son Riccotti has been summoned to his bedside at Caprera.

In Konigsberg, Prussia, on the 14th inst., sixty-two persons were attacked by cholera and twenty-two died.
