GODFREY.—In Park Valley, Box Elder County, March 1, 1885, of dropsy, Mary Reeves Godfrey, born August 6th, 1820, in the State of New Jersey; moved with her parents to Roseville, Ill., where she married George Coleman, and embraced the gospel in 1849; came to Nauvoo in 1843; was expelled by a mob from there in 1846, and removed to Winter Quarters, where her husband, who subsequently died while on the march to California, enlisted in the Mormon Battalion.
