Edward Lee, a convict in New York Clinton prison, has realized \$5,000 from a patent on an improved window-shutter. The money has been placed on interest, and will have amounted to a handsome fortune in seventeen years, the length of time before his sentence expires.

Weekly asks the Iquestion: "If the word 'baptize,' in the New Testament, were correctly translated into English, would it be 'sprinkle' or 'immerse?' '' Whereupon the editor of that journal replies: "The word baptize is not a translation at all, but a transliteration of the Greek word. The Greek ordinarily signifies immersion, though not necessarily submersion. It certainly could not be translated sprinkle."
