It does not appear that young Dalton was in the custody of the marshal, and the offense for which he had been indicted is a misdemeanor. In this connection the following legal authorities define the crime that has been committed:

"There is a very broad distinction between forcible opposition to an arrest and attempting to flee from it. In cases of misde-meanor, there is no rule of law that takes away from a man who flees from an attempted arrest the right to defend his life. An officer in such cases is not justified in shooting st a person whom he is attempting to arrest, because he will not stop."-Criminal Law of Cal., Sec. 835.

'Mere words spoken will not constitute an arrest; there must be some-thing by way of physical restraint."-1 Bisnop's Crim.nal Procedure, Sec.
