the disease in that country, in propor-tion to the population. In St. Petersburg, from the first appearance of the disease, on the 29th of August, 1870, there have been 6,817 cases and 2,797 deaths. In Moscow and its environs the epidemic is of a malignant character. In some remote villages where medical assistance is difficult to obtain, it has committed fearful ravages. The following is the report from Moscow of the let instant: Cases remaining 573, new cases 69, deaths 33. Since the 13th of March there have been 3,568 cases. and 1,643 deaths. 
