WASHINGTON, 28 .- The Postoffice Department's report shows the deficiency for the first nine months of the fiscal year, ending June 30th, to be \$2,199,842; estimated deficiency for the year, \$2,600,000, or less than for any previous year since 1867.

The Internal Revenue Bureau has prepared a comparative statement showing the receipts from several specific sources of revenue for the fiscal year ending June 20th, 1879 and 1880. Owing to the reduction from 24 to 16 cents per pound on manufactured tobacco, the receipts from this source fell off \$3,584,150, Owing to the abolition of the 32 cent rate tax on snuff and the establish-Pumps, Etc.

Fact tax on shift and the estates in the control of a uniform rate of 16 cents per pound, the receipts from this source decreased \$267,329. The heaviest increase under the tobacco division was from cigars and cheroots, \$2,061,412. The total revenue in 1880 from tobacco in all shapes. cigars, snuff, etc., was \$38,870,140 as against \$40,135,007 in 1879, showing a decrease from those sources of \$1,-Caps.
