They will evacuate San Juan, Ponce and Caguas in the month of October. Under the armistice they must not be allowed to do anything but what is necessary to maintain their position. The Spanish authorities here must control the transports in this respect. They must await the pleasure of Madrid.

Kingston, Jamaica, Sept. 16.—The hurricane of Sunday was undoubtedly the worst visitation of the kind experienced by the West Indies during the century. Two hurricanes struck the island chain, from Barbadoes westward to St. Vincent, and thence northward to St. Kitts, where it was least heard from. Barbadoes suffered most from rain, which destroyed the crops and roofs as it did on St. Kitts and other islands, while the center of the storm swept over St. Vincent and Guadeloupe.
