WANT WATER FOR POWER PROJECTS.

Music Teacher Has Scheme to
Divert Water from Green River
For Electric Plant.

WASATCH MAKES APPLICATION

Lorenzo Lyman of Vernal Wants to
Conserve Water for Irrigation
Purposes.

Now that the Uintah lands have been open long enough for men to enter and locate points of diversion for water channels, filings are beginning to reach the office of State Engineer Caleb W. Tanner in large numbers. Water is wanted for irrigation schemes, for power plants, and making electric energy.

A claim that reached the office yesterday afternoon is from J. A. Anderson, a music teacher, who wants 400 seconds from the Green river, and the junction of the North and West Forks of the Duchesne is named as the point of diversion. The application states that the water is to be used to make electric energy for distribution in Salt Lake and Utah counties. The water is to be taken out through a canal 500 feet in length, and then sent over six 30-inch Fallot wheels, producing a power of 2000. The power plant will be located near the center of the south line of section 30, township 1, south range 7 west, Uintah meridian and base line.

WASATCH POWER SCHEME.

Another extensive filing on water was that of the Wasatch Development company, which asks for five different applications. The first is for 20 seconds to be taken from the Green river between 15 and 20 miles downstream, commencing at 7:30 o'clock. A full attendance is requested.
