Beaver City, Beaver Co., Nov. 9 .--Funeral services were held yesterday a the meetinghouse in Beaver West ward, over the remains of Patriarch William James Cox, who died on the 6th inst of pneumonia. Elder Cox bore the distinction of be-ing the oldest man in Beaver county, aving been born in Nashville, Tenn. me 18, 1815, the date of the memorable battle of Waterloo and was in his 91st year. He embraced the Gospel Feb. 20, 1544, settled in Nauvoo in 1845, crossed 1944, settled in Nauvoo in 1845, crossed the plains to Utah in 1850, and in 1851 he was ordained a Seventy, and in 1851 months later a High Priest. The game year he went to southern California, taking a prominent part in the develop-ment of the "Mormon" colony there. In February, 1858, he came to Beaver, and has been one of the comest movers in

He rep-resented Beaver county in the terri-torial Legislature for two tems from 1863 to 1867, and served faithfully as probate judge for a number of years. His ecclesiastical duties received his earnest attention, and in June, 1893, he was ordained a Patriarch. He was married to Delilah Fortester in 1837, in Missouri, and subsequently to Jose-
