STREET GRADES

City Attorney Hoge submitted an ordinance prescribing the form and ordinance prescribing the form and mode of local assessments and providing for establishing and hringing to grade any of the streets, alleyways, etc. To the City Council it delegates the power to all such work, what proportion of the cost shall be defrayed by local assessment, and provides that in every case one-half the expense shall be paid out of the street or contingent funds. Laid over until the next regular meeting.

NAMES AND AMOUNTS OF SALARIES.

Editor Deseret News:

As it will be of interest and importance to persons proposing to settle or colonize in Mexico, we wish to extend the information that the general government of Mexico has favorably answered our petition in granting our colonists the privilege to pass into Mexico at Ciudad Juarez (Paso del Norte), opposite El Paso, Texas, where the Mexican frontler custom house is

situated, as well as at this point.
The Deming route has been convenient and over good roads to our
