CITY TAXES.

I wish to call the attention of all persons owing City Taxes, to the following extract from the ordinance now in force providing for the collection of taxes:

"If any person neglect or fall to pay his taxes on or before the Slat day of October, in the year the taxes are assessed, it shall be the duty of the collector to levy upon enough taxable personal property of the taxpayer to pay the taxes and property to pay the taxes.
