LOCAL BRIEFS.

Delegates to Albuquerque—These delegates to Albuquerque left last evening: J. D. Wadley, R. D. Wadley of Pleasant Grove; W. O. Knudsen, Brigham City; J. T. Adkins, St. George.

Open Bids Monday—The board of education will meet Monday noon to open bids for the 18-room school building, to be erected on the Walker site, on Ninth South, between Main and West Temple streets.

New Conductors Laid—The Independent Telephone company has its new conductors laid from Ninth to Thirtieth East street, on First South, in advance of the pavers, and will pull the cables through the coming week.

Bids for Jefferson School—Bids for the new school house on Walker's field will be opened Monday afternoon, at a meeting of the board of education. Former bids received failed to comply with the specifications, and were rejected.

Nelson Family Reunion—A reunion of the Nelson family will be held at Bountiful, Davis county, Oct. 8. All persons interested are invited to attend. A. C. Fisher, of Richmond, is secretary of the association, and the announcement is authorized by him.

Expensive Storm—The street department estimates the damage done by the recent heavy rains will amount to fully \$1,500. Teams are now at work cleaning up the mud and sand washed down Brigham street and First and Second avenues, and other places affected by the storm.

Sentenced to Death—Arthur Solomon, arrested a few days ago on the charge of keeping a mischievous dog was found guilty by Judge DeHaven yesterday afternoon, and was sentenced to death. The dog had a playful habit of chewing up the neighbors' chickens, but his career will be cut short today.

Reception for Pastor—The parishioners of Rev. M. Heimick of the First church gave him a pleasant reception last evening at his home, in honor of the sixth year of his presence in the city. The reception was held at the residence, which included a musical program, and an address of welcome from Judge C. W. Adams.

Mayor Approves—Mayor Bransford has approved the action of the city council of Monday night rescinding the contract with the Bell Telephone company, in which the city had the use of 50 free telephone lines.

Dr. Douglas Bailed—The fifteenth infant, indicted in a "night problem" last evening at Fort Douglas, when one battalion went out to make a raid on the "hot spots," there to defend it. How many were "killed" in the raid is unknown. The regiment will leave the city tomorrow, and the weather is being favorable for a resumption of the practice march that was so rudely broken up this week. The command will be away three days.

Soups Thrown Out—There was a "soup house" at the L. D. S. university yesterday afternoon, but it was of very short duration. Freshmen were holidaying, and when they rushed a crowd of sophomores and sought to break up the gathering, the freshmen, on the part of the "freshies," refused to yield, and the class members arose and forced the intruders out. Dave Smith, more belligerent than his fellow students, was picked up and thrown out, and the freshmen finished the meeting in peace.

Car Brake Company Incorporates—Articles of incorporation of the Car Brake & Coupler Company, developed by the county clerk. The headquarters of the company are at Salt Lake City and the purpose of the incorporation is to manufacture the inventions covered by letters patent of the United States, No. 893,781 and 895,617 on an automatic car brake and automatic air brake device, respectively, secured by Mr. Knut W. Carlgren of Salt Lake City. The capital stock of the company is placed at \$75,000, divided into shares of the value of 10 cents each. Four hundred thousand shares have been subscribed, the remaining 250,000 shares being placed in the treasury for development purposes. The officers are: Knut W. Carlgren, president; K. E. Carlgren, vice president; Brigham Oleg, secretary; William B. Pratt, treasurer; and Charles Carlgren is named as general manager.
